

#### **First Care Visit**

The first care visit for delivery of electrical appliances took place on Saturday October 11th afternoon, with 6 volunteers who were split into 2 teams. The volunteers included President Norman, Dir. Kevin, and his friend Tina, PE William's spouse Fanny and Rotaractor Nicole. A staff member from St James Settlement was there to accompany each team for the visits. Delivery of small appliances and goody bags to families in Shamshuipo. All families visited were in buildings without lifts, so the teams had to carry the goods by walking up 3 to 5 floors. Keep up the good and valuable work. More care visits are planned for the coming months and President Norman has issued a schedule for the dates, stating "It is also a good learning experience for our family members and friends to understand better about the low income families in Hong Kong. The visits are normally arranged on Sat. with some at AM and some at PM. Please plan your schedule and reserve your seats early as we can only allow 6 volunteers to split into 2 teams on each visit schedule.

## SPOTLIGHT ON: THE ONE



THE ONE, was conceptualised and founded by Past District Governor David Harilela 2011-2012, and is the first international humanitarian award launched by Rotary International District 3450 (RI D3450).

His idea was simple - to find the unsung heroes of today by accessing the powerful Rotary network of over 1.2 million

people. As signified by the Rotary motto, Rotary's main objective is service — in the community, in the workplace, and throughout the world. As he commented in an interview "When I first said I wanted to do this award and set the standard of service above self, everyone said, "You can't find a person like that." But we had a lot of applications from almost 10 countries. Every one of the finalists has been phenomenal. Every one of them has actually lived up to that standard. Our challenge now is to make every year better and better so that **THE ONE** can grow and affect more and more lives around the world."

**THE ONE** award will go to that special caring individual who truly puts *Service Above Self* – **THE ONE** who dedicates his life to helping those in need every single day.

THE ONE is someone who dedicates himself or herself to the improvement of mankind, works for the highest standard of good, acts with compassion and kindness and can come from

any part of the world, regardless of gender, race or ethnic background. A person who wakes up every morning and puts others before himself/herself and dedicates his or her life to helping others in need., truly embodying the rotary motto "Service above Self"

The winner will be awarded with prize money of US \$100,000, funded by **THE ONE**. Each of the three finalists will be awarded with prize money of US\$50,000, donated by the award sponsor Peter Bennett Foundation. The award money must be used to further the awardees' respective humanitarian-cause and service projects. The winner will also receive a custom-designed trophy designed by the founder himself and kindly manufactured and sponsored by Baccarat. A commemorative plaque will also be received and displayed on the head office building of the awarded foundation, displaying the recognition from Rotary International. An award of US \$5,000 also goes to the Rotary Club that nominated the recipient of **THE ONE** award.

**THE ONE** recognises the invisible heroes of the world. Empowering their humanitarian work with award money, so as to help them to magnify their good work, while inspiring others to support them, and be like them. Thus radiating a truly positive affect on humanity.

**THE ONE 2014** was Barbara Hofmann, the "Advocate of hope in Mozambique" who devotes her life to helping marginalised children with health, hunger and literacy programmes in Mozambique, a country devastated by 30 years of war.

Since its inauguration , **THE ONE** has been ensured great media coverage and attention, helped in no small part by the selfless presence and devotion of its Ambassador Donnie Yen, who is today the world's most recognised international Chinese movie star. To date **THE ONE** has garnered over HKD\$4.6 million worth of media coverage (PRO BONO) since 2012

THE ONE is extremely well run, and a stewardship committee has been established to ensure that all money given to awardees would be properly spent. All the awardees also have to submit mid-term reports and final report under certain criteria before they can receive the award money. All bills and expenses have to be reported and copies sent to us, and awardees are reminded that the logos of Rotary and THE ONE must be suitably and prominently displayed in the premises which are built/renovated/enhanced using the award money.



### **Emergency Fund**

THE ONE continues to evolve as we strive to do more to help those in need, and to allow our angels to sustain themselves and continue to grow THE ONE has this year also initially set aside US\$100,000 as funds which we will allocate for use by our finalists and winners as an emergency aid fund.

#### **THE ONE Hong Kong**

For the first time since it was established, there will a special award for **THE ONE** Hong Kong, by which special Hong Kong Individuals who have provided outstanding and remarkable service to mankind in this city can be nominated for the award locally. The criteria for being nominated is that they must be qualified as a Hong Kong Resident, and have worked for their cause for a minimum of five years in Hong Kong, and demonstrated daily dedication and continued devotion to humanitarian efforts and promoted integrity and advanced understanding, goodwill and harmony in society through their humanitarian work. Nominees must be part of a HKSAR Government approved charitable organisation or to a Rotary Club in Hong Kong.

**THE ONE** Hong Kong will be awarded Cash prize HK\$ 100,000 and a Trophy which is sponsored by The Chainrai Foundation. Nominations for **THE ONE** Hong Kong do not have to be endorsed by a Rotary Club (unlike **THE ONE** international), while nominations from Rotary Clubs and Rotarians are welcome. **THE ONE** Hong Kong will automatically qualify as a semi-finalist of **THE ONE** International Humanitarian Award.
