SPOTLIGHT ON: Hong Kong's current situation and the vision for the future



PP Tim recapitulated the list of events which led to prolonged "Occupy" movement in Hong Kong over the process towards 2017 political reform. It b e g a n with conceptualization on the "Occupy Central" movement which

stimulated publicized wishes from HK political parties and LegCo members for months before the Chinese Government issued its white paper on Hong Kong. Subsequently, NPCSC provided decision on the 2017 political reform on 31 Aug 2014 and Students boycotted lessons in response to the decision which evolved into Umbrella Movement involving the 28th Sept 2014 incidents.

Resulting from the prolonged "Occupy" movements, PP Tim noted the Short-to-Medium Term impact to HK which included: (1) Disruptions to citizen's way of life, (2) Polarization towards two extremes within society causing a rift between citizens, family & friends, (3) Tourism warning & reduction in Mainland tourist visiting HK and (4) Significant reduction in business volume for operators in occupied territories; for the Long Term, the impact to HK included: (1) Erosion of HK core values [Law & Order and Harmony], (2) LegCo and other non co-operative measures adversely affecting strategic development of HK, (3) Political uncertainty leading to downward adjustment to credit rating, (4) Questionability of economic outlook (employment opportunities, wage increase and etc.), (5) No direct LegCo election in 2020 if 2017 election plans are not implemented, (6) Chinese Government adopting tighter attitude towards HK and (7) Post 2047 HK status.

Some factual reality was outlined, including: (1) HK is a Special Administrative Region of the PRC and (2) the concern goes beyond political reform and control & management of HK into PRC national's economic and security interests are at the heart of the issues.

The floor was then opened up for discussion and members declared neutral political positioning before commenting. The points conveyed during the open floor included: (1) CNN and Bloomberg news relating to HK's "Occupy" movements has been broadcast without editing in China was a precedent in China, (2) Local council & LegCo members in HK remained low profile after "Occupy" movements began seems unusual from their past actions and (3) actions towards blockage resources and talks between student leaders with HK government appeared well strategized for a leaderless movement.

To conclude the talk, PP Tim feels it is important to move forward in resolving the situation that required: (1) Pursue dialogue to seek resolution, (2) Some minor concessions can be offered as per meeting held on 21st Oct 2014 and (3) Go back to the 2nd phase consultation and maximize outcome.


