Then, with this day being the 7th day of the Chinese New Year which is the birthday of the whole human race, we held a birthday celebration for each and everyone, with the

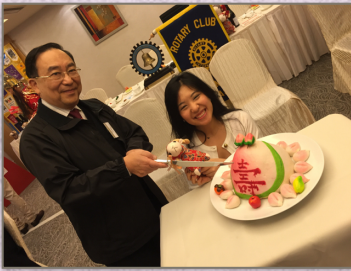
