SPOTLIGHT ON: Music in Advertising

Have you ever wondered who the people are who make the music in the films we watch? The TV shows and TV commercials etc. Well James Banbury is one such character. PN Chris Kyme introduced James to fellow Rotarian members, and he shared with us his younger years and the events leading to his career development in the music industry which later led to specialisation into advertising music. He provided insights into advertising music projects which required interaction with visual effects and lyrics, and how approached composing for such projects. In addition, he gave our guests an understanding in the evolution to advertising songs with the impact of technology innovations including internet and social media. Also, James shared his experiences with advertising songs which used existing popularized songs and newly developed advertising songs. The legal aspects of this was also briefly touched on.



JAMES BANBURY, COMPOSER



James Banbury of Component has worked in the UK and Hong Kong music industry for over 25 years.

While at music college in London he signed a publishing deal with cutting edge label Rhythm King (Bomb The Bass, S-Express) releasing some hit records before joining indie band The Auteurs (Virgin Records) as cellist and keyboard player. He spent much of the 90s recording albums and touring with The Auteurs, performing on TV, and moonlighting as a session cellist for various luminaries of the Britpop scene.

James has been composing for Television since the mid-00s, including theme tunes for ITV, documentaries for

the BBC, and commercials for Kelloggs, Cathay Pacific, Marriott, Proctor & Gamble, and Sony.

He relocated to Hong Kong with his family in August 2010 and set up the music production company, Component, working closely with his co-composer and co-producer in Stockholm Pete Davis, on music projects spanning the globe.
