Water Project Information

Concept Note: From WorldVision

Provision of water for vulnerable Syrians in the Bekaa

Location: Informal Settlements (ISs) of the Bekaa Valley, Lebanon

Timeframe: June-December 2019

Beneficiaries: 2,750 Syrian refugee individuals

Budget: USD70,530 (HKD553,660)

The eight-year-long conflict erupted in Syria has brought massive destruction and disruption to the country and civilians. There requires a large amount of resources and time to restore. Until this day, because of the conflict, it is still impossible for over 5.9 million Syrian children to return home, with the losses of their loved ones, homes and future remaining uncompensated.

General context: Needs Assessment

Syrian refugees in Bekaa are susceptible to the high cost of basic needs and most often have little funding to address any need outside of rent and food. Adding to this, Syrian refugees live in over-crowded informal settlements (ISs) on private or public land relying on insecure tenure. Existing Lebanese infrastructure - often old and poorly maintained - is unable to cope with this increased demand; therefore, ISs are rarely connected to existing public water and sanitation networks. As a result, basic water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) needs are not being met: Syrian refugees are still lacking access to basic WASH services and infrastructure.

To address this, since 2013 and with the support of United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), World Vision Lebanon (WVL) has been providing WASH assistance to targeted Syrian refugee populations across Bekaa as part of WVL WASH Emergency intervention in the region. In April 2019, WVL was providing around 50,051 individuals with equitable access to sufficient quantity of safe water for drinking, cooking, personal and domestic hygiene in informal settlements. However, WVL operations teams have assessed one critical gap in the Informal Settlements covered by the emergency WASH programming. The gap was especially noted in North Bekaa, the new area of intervention acquired by WVL in November 2018. In Informal Settlements of North Lebanon, **500 households** lack access to water tanks, which is preventing them from benefitting from the water trucking services delivered by WVL.

Proposed intervention:

The contribution from the Rotary Club and its members will support the on-going effort of WVL in the Bekaa by allowing the provision of water to 500 Syrian refugee families in informal settlements through the purchase and installation of 500 water tanks with a capacity of 1000 liters each. A total of 2,750 Syrian refugee will benefit directly from the installation of the water tanks considering an average of 5.5 individuals per household.

By aligning this intervention with the UNICEF timeline, quality water will be supplied through water trucking services to the targeted 500 households deprived of water tanks for a period of 6 months from July to December 2019. The provision of water will be distributed as follows:

4 rounds per month from July till October 2019 (20-30 liters per person per day) and 2 rounds per month for November and December 2019 (around 15 liters per person per day).

Methodology to distribute water and monitor water quality:

WVL is working with different suppliers (currently 7 suppliers for water trucking). Each supplier has a well that is periodically tested by WVL for microbiological and physico-chemical parameters. Suppliers are only allowed to get water from the approved wells (meeting the quality standards). Suppliers have to chlorinate the water with a free residual chlorine of 0.5 mg/l concentration. The chlorine is mainly to kill the bacteria present in water tanks or during the water transportation from the well to the informal settlement. Suppliers use trucks to deliver the water.

WVL will also monitor the quality of the water delivered by conducting regular water tests for the supplier source, the water trucks, and the Syrian refugees' water tanks occasionally.

For ISs connected to a water source, WVL will conduct microbiological and chemical water tests depending on emergency referrals or depending on the WAP assessment needs (validity of 3 months for Feacal Coliform (FC) and Turbidity, and at least once a year for Nitrates).

Budget and Timeframe:

Timeframe: Through the month of July 2019, WV will be procuring and installing the tanks. 500 water tanks with a capacity of 1000 L each will be purchased and installed in the targeted households.

Then for a period of 6 months from July to December and in alignment with the UNICEF timeline, WVL will be providing water through water trucking services and monitoring water quality to the 500 households in the IS.

Budget: The total budget will comprise the cost of procuring and installing 500 water tanks and the cost of providing water trucking services for a period of 6 months.

Cost of water tank supplied and installed around 56 USD è Cost of 500 water tanks purchased and installed around **28,000 USD** (56x500)

The cost of providing one round of 1000 L water trucking services per household is around 3.25 USD. Considering the project duration of 6 months and the plan of water distribution, the monthly cost during the project period varies as follows:

From July to October 2019, there will be 2000 household rounds each month (500 households x 4 rounds of water distribution each month). The monthly cost will be 6,500 USD (2000 household rounds x 3.25 USD).

From November to December 2019, there will be 1000 household rounds each month (500 households x 2 rounds of water distribution each month). The monthly cost will be 3,250 USD (2000 household rounds x 3.25 USD)

The cost for the part of water trucking will be 32,500 USD.

With the above illustration of the calculation of the water trucking cost, the following table shows the total budget of the project and its breakdown:
