Rotary has been working to eradicate polio for more than 35 years. Our goal of ridding the world of this disease is closer than ever.

As a founding partner of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, we've reduced polio cases by 99.9 percent since our first project to vaccinate children in the Philippines in 1979.

Rotary members have contributed more than \$2.1 billion and countless volunteer hours to protect nearly 3 billion children in 122 countries from this paralyzing disease. Rotary's advocacy efforts have played a role in decisions by governments to contribute more than \$10 billion to the effort

Today, polio remains endemic only in Afghanistan and Pakistan. But it's crucial to continue working to keep other countries polio-free. If all eradication efforts stopped today, within 10 years, polio could paralyze as many as 200,000 children each year.

To eradicate polio, multiple high-quality immunization campaigns must continue to be given priority. Even during the COVID-19 pandemic, it's necessary to keep children vaccinated against polio while also protecting health workers from COVID-19 and making sure they don't contribute to its transmission.

Global health officials and experts say that sustained fundraising and advocacy are still crucial, not only to protect gains in Africa, but to reach the ultimate goal of a world without polio. Rotary members still have a critical role to play in keeping the African region free of wild poliovirus and eliminating the virus in the two countries where polio remains endemic. Rotary International President Holger Knaack said, "This is a big step in our journey to a polio-free world, but the fight is not over yet. We still need the support of our Rotary members, donors, and heroic effort of health care workers to finish the job."

Community Service Project: Colour Away Covid with Rotary

October 10th Service Outing: Delivered Children's Masks to the Children's Kidney Fund. The Colour Away Covid Committee did exceptionally well in fund raising a total of 120,000HKD for their community service project (of which HKIE donated 40,000HKD). So, October 10th 2020 was a monumental day because it was the day that 65,000 masks were delivered to 3 charities in Hong Kong!

We at HKIE were happy to support the delivery! With the help of our Fellow Rotarian Rtn. Mike Ellis from the Rotary Club of Bangkok South, we connected with Allied Pickford HK who very generously supported this project by providing their high quality logistics free of charge!

On October 10th, P Leo and PP Stacy met three of the Colour Away Covid committee members at the Renaissance College (who sponsored the storage space). P Leo was the happy chauffeur driving the committee members + PP Stacy around Hong Kong to the three different delivery points. P Leo made sure that the logistic delivery went smoothly. The charities that received the 65,000 masks were: Children's Kidney Fund, SoCo, Martha Boss Lutheran Community Centre and two charities in Malaysia.

Our last stop was at the Children's Kidney Fund delivery point - the Children's Hospital. We met Ms. Tsang and we delivered the 20,000 masks (HKIE Sponsored) to the ward. It was a great and incredibly efficient service outing! The three Colour Away Committee members we met are extremely bright and they have so much passion to serve the community. We look forward to working with them in the future!
