Rotary Takes Root in Asia Celebrating 80 years of Change and Growth

Rotary came to Asia in 1919. When the first club was chartered in Manila, the Philippines, many people considered Rotary as an alien import and there was considerable worry whether it could acclimate itself to Asian soil. Confronting the doubt about the growth in Asia, Tsunejiro Miyaoka, a Japanese diplomat and international lawyer who would later became a member of Rotary's Board of Director, said, "Rotary's spirit fits in exactly with our philosophy of life because it teaches service and cooperation. Rotary will bring about harmony and rightful understanding among peoples in Asia who differ widely in blood descent, historical background, language, religious faith and economic conditions."

History proved the correctness of Mr. Miyaoka's words, and the resilience and universal appeal of Rotary's spirit of service and volunteerism. Eighty years after Rotary came to Asia, it has taken roots and blossomed all over the continent. The sheer membership statistics speak volume. At present, there are 7,000 clubs, with 285,000 members in 17 countries and regions, accounting for 25 percent of Rotary's 1.2 million membership worldwide.

For the past 80 years, Asian Rotarians have not only made tremendous financial contribution to the organization's worldwide humanitarian efforts, they have also changed the face of



LAUGH FOR THE WEEK


A wife arrived home from a shopping trip and was shocked to find her husband in bed with a lovely young woman.
