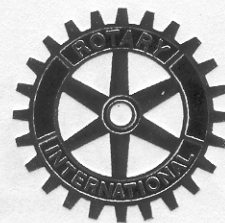

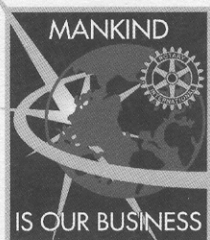

President Taj opened the meeting by explaining that some members, PDG Uncle Peter, PP John Kwok and Rtn Ates were in the US attending the Rotary International Convention. He pleased present members by observing that we had quality rather than quantity in attendance.

PP C.Y. performed the one introduction: Rtn Bob Wilson from HK South. C.Y. also reported that there were 14 members present and \$1,100 had been donated.

PP Rob then reported on Club Service for the year 2000-2001: He said that the speaker program had been very ably managed by Rtn Henry Loy, and congratulated him in his absence. He outlined some of the themes which had attracted a number of speakers, including medical issues, environmental problems, people in the community we should care for, and the nine HKIE members who gave addresses during the year. In addition to this program, there were several open forums during which members had the opportunity to talk about the running of the Club. There was a Christmas lunch party and the major social event, the annual dinner at Ocean Park, which was very ably coordinated by PE Chris. The Club won the award for the best English bulletin for the year, the third time running. Tung Feng was given a facelift during the year which certainly lifted its appearance. PP Rob thanked the team which contributed to the production of our bulletin: Miriam, Chris, Henry, Malcolm and PP John and Rudy for their paparazzi talents.

PP Rob also mentioned a few disappointments during the year: These included our membership growth that continues to need urgent attention; attendance from some members which is far from satisfactory; and the need to use the Sergeant at Arms more effectively in the Club meetings. Finally, he referred to the initial discord at the beginning of the year which, in his opinion, is a healthy sign that members are interested in the workings of their club, and are willing to give their opinions on change. He also said that he believes that each President is entitled to put his mark on the Club for their year, and that members should get behind the person who is putting in so much of their valuable time in leading the Club. He promised President Stephen that he would give him his full support for 2001-2002.

Next off the block, PE Chris spoke about his responsibilities during the year, principally as the International Services Director: There was the student exchange sponsored by our Club in which two students from CityU were helped to travel to Singapore to study IT developments. International visits were a feature, and some of our members travelled to our sister club, Penang, to take part in their 70th anniversary celebrations; and members from Makati North came to visit us and enjoy our annual dinner celebration. Having already seven sister clubs overseas, the Board decided not to form any more partnerships, but instead to strengthen ties with the partnerships we already have.

Chris said that, as Vice President, he did not have much to do because most of the work was attended to by Pres. Taj. As our Club's representative on the annual dinner organizing committee, he was satisfied with the outcome. We had 18 of our members present with 22 guests, and the 27 members from Makati North made our contingent the biggest there. In the washout, we received about \$10,000 from the profits.

PE Stephen then briefly addressed the meeting in order to thank President Taj for all his dedication and work for the Club during the year. He also particularly thanked our secretary, Miriam, and Rtn Eddie for their contributions in assisting him. He finally reported on the small group of members who will be travelling to Makati North on 18 July.

The highlight of the meeting was the handover. President Taj handed over the Club collar to PE Stephen and our new President Stephen immediately awarded our new IPP Taj with his PP pin.

To close the meeting, President Stephen proposed a toast to the Rotary Club of HK South.

President Devlyn says good-bye, announces Virtual Convention prize

All who register for the Virtual Convention by 21:00 hours (9:00 p.m.) on 27 June stand a chance to win two round-trip tickets on the 2002 RI Convention in Barcelona, Spain, RI President Frank J. Devlyn announced on 19 June at a farewell meeting with staff at RI World Headquarters in Evanston, Illinois, USA. President Devlyn will be succeeded by 2001-2002 RI President Richard D. King on 1 July.

In his valedictory speech, the RI president encouraged all RI staff and Rotarians to seize every opportunity availed by their association with Rotary to render community and international service. He also appealed to them to work hard towards the growth of the organization.

"It is not enough to be a good Rotarian or Rotary International staff," he said. "Bring someone into Rotary so that RI grows bigger and stronger, and continues to do the good things for which it is known." President Devlyn pledged his total support for incoming RI President King.

Gloria Rita, his wife, also bade farewell to all the RI staff. "I have been very happy these two years we have been in Evanston. It has been wonderful - knowing everybody and traveling throughout the U.S. and the world," she said. "But, I think, for me and for Frank, it is time to go home to our children and grandchildren, whom we miss very much."

RI President receives humanitarian award

The Great Chicago chapter of the United Nations Association (UNA) has presented RI President Frank J. Devlyn with the organization's humanitarian award in recognition of Rotary's efforts in the eradication of polio.

"This award is a great honor for all Rotarians who have committed themselves to creating awareness about the humanitarian needs of people around the world and have taken action to ensure that the resources and services available are mobilized to improve the lives of those who most need it," the RI president said. "The PolioPlus program, a unique global undertaking in the health sector and a fine example of a private/public partnership between Rotary and other organizations, is one of many humanitarian initiatives for which Rotarians are known."

President Devlyn received the award on 7 June at a UNA Conference on Infectious Diseases at the Hilton & Towers, Chicago, Illinois, USA. Participants at the event discussed global and local health topics that included HIV/AIDS, malaria, polio and tuberculosis.

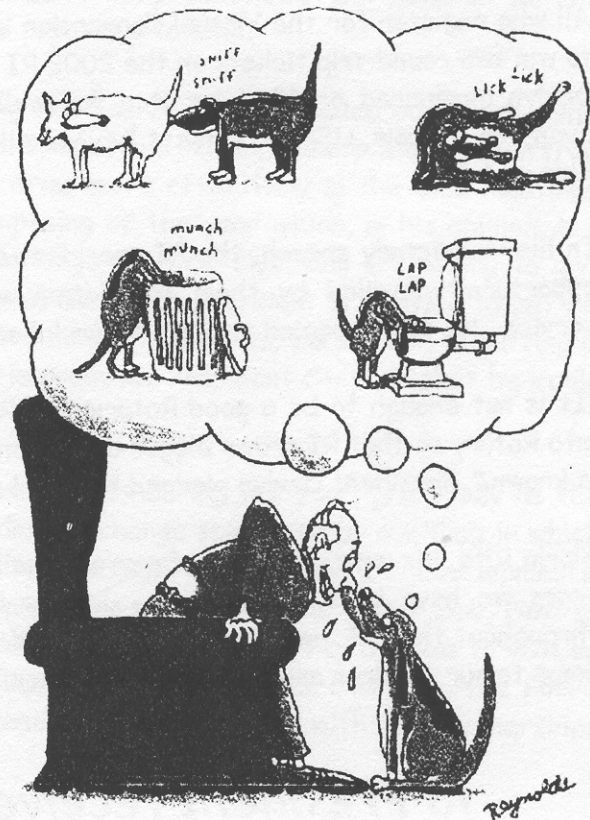

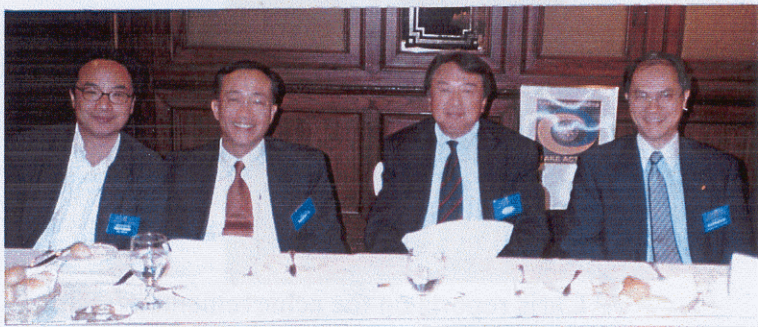
