Chartered on 6 April, 1954 by Charter President PDG (Uncle) John Yuen Mrs. Ho retired from Government in October 1997 after 28 years' service. Her last posting was Deputy Secretary in the then Health and Welfare Branch. Her previous postings included secondment to the Provisional Airport Authority as Director of Administration; Principal Assistant Secretary in the Planning, Environment and Lands Branch; and Secretary of the Provisional Council for Academic Accreditation. Her topic with us was: 'Around the World in 80 Ways - Hong Kong Challenge.'

Mrs. Ho shared that this campaign had been launched already. She shared the background information of this activity, which was solely sponsored by the Hong Kong Jockey Club for their activities in Hong Kong. Due to the recent economic downturn, high unemployment rate, job insecurity, low morale, lacking in self-confidence and high suicide rate, the campaign encouraged people to 'Give a Cheer!' The slogan is "Yes! Can Do!"

She then shared the background and details of the members of this team. They are:

- 1. Mr. Mike MacKenzie, lost his leg and presently in a wheelchair
- 2. Mr. Miles Hilton-Barber, blind for 20 years and a Marathon runner
- 3. Ms. Caroline Casey, legally blind since the age of 17
- 4. Mr. Robin Dunseath, team leader and also an adventure leader with a bad heart

Around the World in 80 Ways is an adventure devised by, Mr. Robin Dunseath, which seeks to inspire people to live their lives to their full potential, no matter what difficulties they face; and to inspire people to set their own goals and undertake their own challenges.


Based on the legendary novel, "Around the World in 80 Days" by Jules Verne, a modern Phileas Fogg team will try to go around the world in 80 different forms of transport. For example, members of this team will have to swim under the Red Sea for 5 miles and riding elephants. The team will stop by to Hong Kong during 4^{th} November and will complete their journey on 3^{rd} December in London.

This significant project would like to spread the positive message to the Hong Kong public. If these people can do, why can't we? A number of activities would be held during their visit including: Business Challenge and Racing.

Mrs. Ho ended her sharing with a challenge to members to join the Business Challenge and reminded us to spread this good message to at least 3 people.

Rtn. Rudy thanked Mrs. Ho positive message and can do attitude. He shared that let the world discover that Hong Kong still has this can do attitude.

The meeting ended with a toast to RI and the club of HK Island East.



The Rotary Foundation alters grants formula - Last year, the World Fund used all of the money budgeted for Matching Grants before the end of the Rotary year, primarily because of an unprecedented number of grants applications. Last year, as has happened repeatedly, a sizable amount of District Designated Funds (Share System) remained unused.

To bring the two funds into better balance and increase opportunities for Rotary clubs and districts to carry out international service projects, The Rotary Foundation Trustees are revising the formula for allocating Annual Programs Fund contributions.

Beginning in the 2006-07 Rotary Year, the allocation to the World Fund will increase from 40 to 50 percent. To pave the way for that increase, the allocation to District Designated Funds will decrease from 60 to 50 percent, beginning in 2003-04.

Also, beginning 1st July 2002, the Trustees will match 50 percent - no longer 100 percent - of cash contributions from individual, clubs, and districts for Matching Grants projects. (The Match for District Designated Funds contributions will remain the same at one to one.) This will make additional funds available in the World Fund so that more clubs and districts can participate in grants.
