Speech for Rotary meeting on 2 July

In addition, Unde Peter and PP Stephen from the PP Council will be holding our hands to make sure we don't go off the rail. On the personal front, as you all know I am very busy with football betting but I am fortunate to have a secretary who is very familiar with Rotary activities. If you are not able to get hold of me, just call Connie and she will be happy to help.

The theme of this Rotary Year is Lend a Hand. RI President Jonathan Majiyagbe has asked us to: Lend a Hand in your Club. Lend a Hand in your vocation. Lend a Hand in your community. Lend a Hand in the world. He has given some specific instructions too: We have been asked to establish a Family of Rotary committee to encourage spouses and children of Rotarians to participate in service projects and Club fellowship activities. This is a very good idea as the involvement of our family in Rotary will give us individually and the Club further support, strengthen the ties between our members and also encourage our spouses and adult children to join Rotary. VP Robert will take the lead in this effort and I hope you all will join in and bring along your family to Club projects and fellowship functions.

We will have the celebration party on 17 April and have booked the Ball Room of AMC. We expect many of our sister clubs will send big delegations to join our celebration and we count on every one of you to help look after them, golfers and party makers in particular. PE Rudy has started collecting materials for the souvenir programme which aims to capture the highlights of our 50 years of Rotary service. Any assistance you are able to offer to PE Rudy will be very much appreciated.

Apart from the celebration party, we are planning to have a major community project to mark our 50th Anniversary. We are aiming at something long lasting and substantial, of course it is subject to availability of funds. This will also be registered as the Centennial Project of our Club, a mandatory requirement for Rotary's Centennial Celebration in 2005, our usual one stone two birds approach. We have some very innovative ideas already and we are looking at both in the physical world as well as the virtual world. PP Hubert and Director Jason will take the lead and they will brief members as soon as the Board has short listed the projects under consideration. Be ware that they may come round with a hat at the same time, we need your support as well as your money and time.

In addition to the family activities that VP Robert will organise locally, Director Laurence supported by PP Stephen will organise visits to our sister dubs. The first one is to at end the 30th Anniversary of Makati North on 16 July and second one is to attend the 35th Anniversary of

Osaka Jonan as well as the RI Convention in May 2004. I am not able to join the visit to Makati but I and my wife have committed to the visit to Osaka in May next year. Please contact Laurence for more details and bring along with your family on these visits if you can.



Jonathan B. Majiyagbe, a Senior Advocate of Nigeria, is principal counsel in J.B. Majiyagbe & Co., with a wide commercial law practice in Nigeria. Born in Lagos, he is a graduate of the University of London.

Mr. Majiyagbe is a member of the Honourable Body of Benchers, a former member of the interim judicial service committee, Kano State, a past vice president of the Nigerian Bar Association, and a member of the International Bar Association. He has served as a trustee of the Kano Lebanon Club and the Kano Club. He was a long-time Chancellor of the Anglican Diocese of Kano and is currently the Chairman, Nigerian Red Cross Society, Kano Branch. Mr. Majiyagbe is also a member of the Kano Chamber of Commerce, Industry Mines and Agriculture.

A Rotarian since 1967, Mr. Majiyagbe is a member and past president of the Rotary Club of Kano. He has served Rotary International as district governor, International Assembly instructor, committee member, director and trustee of the Rotary Foundation. He is a recipient of the Rotary Foundation Meritorious Service and the Distinguished Service Awards.

As Chairman of the African Regional PolioPlus Committee and member of the International PolioPlus Committee, Mr. Majiyagbe is dedicated to the global effort to eradicate polio. Rotary's PolioPlus program, launched in 1985, is an aggressive public/private partnership to assist international health agencies and governments to certify the world as polio-free by the year 2005, Rotary's centennial anniversary. By that year, Rotary will have committed nearly a half billion US dollars to the eradication effort. To date, more than two billion children have been immunized against the deadly poliovirus.
