

What Happened at Our Meeting

18th August, 2004

Pres. Rudy opened the meeting by welcoming DG Alex to our meeting, & a special welcome to one of our former member Mr. Raymond Chung who is going to introduce our speaker for today. Pres. Rudy also introduced a friend of PP John Luk who is Ms Florence Deng. Also the speaker's guest is Diana Yip. He then welcome back Dir Jason from USA. Pres. Rudy then asked DG Alex to come to the rostrum to give his message.

DG Alex announced that the recently concluded Rotaract Conference was a great success and it was due to the efforts of a dedicated Rotarian who is none other then our PDG Y. K. Cheng. Although he is not present today DG Alex still would like to thank him for his hard work.

Pres. Rudy then asked our former member Mr. Raymond Chung to introduce the speaker for today. Raymond told us that our speaker for today is Mr. K.C. Cheng his boss. He is the Vice Chairman & CEO of PME Group Ltd. Today, he will tell us about Metal Polishing.

(d) encourage Rotaractors to attend Rotary Club's weekly meetings

(e) achieve importance of youth in world peace

3. Responsibilities to the Rotaract Club

- (a) involve Rotaract Club in Rotary Club's projects/activities
- (b) attend Rotar act Club's board and regular meetings $% \left(f_{1}, f_{2}, f_{3}, f_{$
- (c) advise on planning of club projects/activities

(d) advise on budget planning and financial control

- (e) participate in Rotaract Club's project/activities
- (f) a dvise on carrying out projects within their means and capabilities
- (g) do not provide financial assistance or help them to solicit money for projects

4. Responsibilities to the Rotaractors

(a) be present - be an adviser and not a task master

(b) show concern, care and understanding

- (c) encourage/motivate be a fatherly figure
- (d) treat the Rotaractors as equals partners in service
- (e) allow Rotaractors to develop leader ship personal development

 - · Caring for others
