Last Week's Proceedings – 7th August, 2013

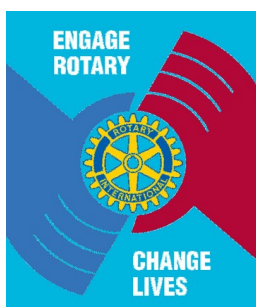

Jonathan invited our Past President and Chief District Secretary Eric Chin to announce the historical breakthrough in achievements of our Youth Service in 2012-13 for our 3 sponsoring Rotaract Clubs: HKIE, Lingnan University Students' Union, Hong Kong Community College Students' Union all receiving Presidential Citations from RI in the District Rotaract Installation and Award Presentation on August 4, 2013 in Science Park. There are only 17 out of 48 Rotaract Clubs in District 3450 receiving this recognition. Adviser PP Eric Chin received the Outstanding Rotaract Adviser Award and Rotaractor John Lo received Club President Award for Outstanding Contribution in Rotaract of HKCC Students' Union.
- 4 President Jonathan also congratulated Public Relations Chair Teresa for her promotion as Director of Food and Beverage in Regal Hong Kong Hotel. In addition, PP Time Lui also took up New Senior Advisor position of Price Waterhouse Coopers. We are all proud of their achievement.

Sergeant At Arm Jonah Cheung was invited to report the Red Box contribution today. We got HK\$2,800 from various members and DG Eugene in this luncheon.

Then it would be the highlight of today's program. Before DG's presentation, Assistant Governor Heman Lam introduced DG with the following background.

DG Eugene is the Director and Deputy General Manager of Junefair Group which specializes in buildings' electrical services and wholesale of electrical cables in Hong Kong and Macau. He is currently the Vice President of the Hong Kong Electrical Contractors Association.

Eugene was the President of Rotary Club of Kowloon West in Rotary year 2007-2008. He then twice became the District Secretary of District 3450, in Rotary years 2008-2009 and 2011-2012 respectively.

Besides trade associations and Rotary, Eugene is actively engaged in community affairs. He is a deacon of Whampoa Tsung Tsin Church, a member of the School Management Committee of Tuen Mun Government Secondary School, president of the Yau Tsim Mong West Area Committee, and has been appointed as a member of the Local Customer Advisory Committee of North District by CLP Power.

Eugene is married to Kitty and is a father of three children: Yvette, Clarice and Lincoln. He holds a Master of Commerce, Bachelor of Economics (Honors), Bachelor of Laws from the University of Sydney, Australia. Eugene is a member of CPA Australia and a fellow of the Financial Services Institute of Australasia.

DG Eugene started his presentation by thanking the active involvement of our PPs in the District management, including Chief District Secretary, Assistant Governor, Committee involvement in Membership, Poverty Alleviation, THE ONE and District Conference. He expressed his sincere thanks for our active support to the District. First of all, he started to remind all members that the name of our District 3450 has been changed to be "Rotary International District 3450 (Hong Kong, Macau, Mongolia and the People's Republic of China – Guangdong Province). Our District will start to help establish local Rotary Clubs in Guangdong Province in the coming years. He also highlighted that the RI theme in 2013-14 is "Engage Rotary, Change Lives" (參與扶輪改變人生). RI President Ron Burton would like all Clubs to engage members, family of Rotary and Youth this year. To engage Rotary is to bring Rotary service and Rotary values into every day of our life and we shall change our own lives as we change others.

In 2013-14, there are several RI Emphasis as follows:

- * Polio is close to being eradicated and all Clubs please continue to support.
- * To engage youth as much as possible.
- * To promote Rotary image through all kinds of social media, such as Facebook, Twitter, Linked In, Vimeo and YouTube etc.
- * To enhance web technology for Clubs to report information through internet so as to eliminate tedious workload
- * Rotary Moment – Encourage members to share their personal rotary experience all outsiders so as to impress them about Rotary
- * All Clubs should update their Club's Constitution in accordance with amendments passed at the recent Council on Legislation

DG Eugene also reiterated the importance of “Core Values of Rotary” and “The Object of Rotary” to all members. According to the RI’s strategic planning, the core values of Rotary include:

Service, Fellowship, Integrity, Diversity & Leadership

“All of these core values are reflected in the Object of Rotary and The Four-Way Test, which we use in our daily lives. They inspire us to foster and support the **ideal of service** for developing and maintaining **integrity in human relations**”

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular to encourage and foster:

He also reminded all members that the Author of the 4-way Test is Rtn Herbert Taylor who wrote it in 1930.

In addition, he further shared with us the “District Priorities” this year with members. In order to tackle the following weakness of D3450, such as

- Not a household name for charity
- Narrow base for District projects, mostly in the area of youth, but few in other fields
- Not fully taking advantage of IT
- Club Luncheon / dinner meeting venues too focused on city areas in Kowloon and HK island side

District will start to use IT extensively in the future by introducing

- On=line Monthly Attendance and Membership Reporting
- Enhanced use of Facebook
- District’s Website – continuous enhancement
- Our first Webinar
- Extensive use of Whatsapps for District Committees
- Support Use of RI’s Member Access, Rotary Central etc
- Build databases for Alumni, Ex-Rotarians and Donors

His strategies in achieving District Priorities included:

1. Strengthening the Clubs
 - Promoting core values of Rotary
 - Promote Cross-Club service and fellowship
 - Encourage Club to bring worthy projects to the District
2. Engage Members and Family of Rotary
 - Encourage use of social media and RI new tools
 - More dialogues with and training for Rotaractors
 - Support preparation for APRRC 2014-15
 - Encourage District Officers to contribute towards own Clubs
 - Building benefits program upon “Rotarians help Rotarians”
 - Mark 22-23 Feb 2014 on each Rotarian’s diary for the District Conference and the Rotary Day
3. Reconnect with Alumni and ex-Rotarians
4. Develop a pool of Rotary Supporters via external fund raising
5. Implement Future Vision Plan
 - Request to continue to support RI Foundation to eradicate Polio and pursue the Six Areas of Focus
 - Request HKIE to qualify for District Grants and Global Grants
6. Build sustainability in Key Service Projects
 - Youth Service
 - Rotary District Adopt a School

- THE ONE
 - Poverty Alleviation – Youth Social Mobility
 - Water
 - Organ Donation
 - Leprosy
7. Develop new service projects closely with government
 8. Build a culture of wise serving

At the end of his presentation, DG Eugene emphasized that the District team is always ready to serve the Clubs' various needs. We should always bring Rotary service and Rotary values into every day of our life. Let's hand in hand to make 13-14 more fruitful to Rotary circle.

After DG's presentation, Pres. Jonathan invited PP Hubert Chan to officially thank our DG. PP Hubert used "head", "heart" and "hand" to elaborate how we can do things better to thank our DG. P Jonathan announced that next week's program would be new member Charles Man's vocational talk.

The meeting was adjourned after Pres. Jonathan made a toast to RI coupled with the Rotary Clubs of Kowloon West, HK Harbour, Kyoto East and Hong Kong Island East. The guests and members stayed for a group photo. The meeting ended at 2:10 pm.

Visit Du Tou Village, Nam Feng, Feng Kai, Zhaoqing with HKCC Rotaract Club

Rotary Club of Hong Kong Island East and our Rotaract Club from Hong Kong Community College Student's Union made a very fruitful and meaningful visit to Do Tou Primary School in Dutou Village, Nam Feng, Feng Kai, Zhaoqing, China from July 6 to 9, 2013.
