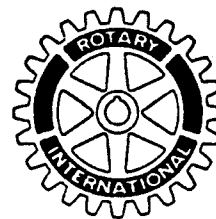

## What Happened Last Week

President Desmond opened the meeting by welcoming IPDG Anthony Hung. And, he welcomed back Rtn Malcolm who had been away for 3 weeks, running around in New Castle, England. Rtn Rudy introduced the visiting Rotarians, Rtn Gerard McMahon and Rtn Michael Duch from Hong Kong Club, Rtn Ken Lai from Kowloon Northeast and PP Hubert Ng from HK Harbour. Rtn Rudy was kept on the stage and was presented the Two Stone Paul Harris Fellow by PDG Uncle Peter.

PP Hubert informed members that Secretary Ates had contacted him from Turkey seeking help for those who have lost their homes in the disastrous earthquake, and that he had contacted the DG and obtained his support for releasing US\$5,000 from the District Emergency Relief fund to help. The DG had also asked IPDG Anthony to co-ordinate with other Clubs in the District for further assistance. IPDG Anthony would have a meeting with President Desmond and PP Hubert to discuss further actions to be taken by our Club.

PE Taj reminded members about the Club Assembly and Fellowship dinner to be held on 9 September at the Deep Water Bay Golf Club and urged members to bring their Rotaryannes and to let him know their choice of menu as early as possible. He promised a very enjoyable evening.

The Sergeant-at-Arms Rtn Paul announced that there were 17 members present and the collected donations amounted to \$1,320.

PP David gave Rotary information and informed members about the types of District Awards and their assessment criteria. There would still be enough time for planning on winning these awards in this Rotary Year.

Our guest speaker was Mr. Paulus Lee, the Director of Finance and Central Services of the Hong Kong Jockey Club and his topic was "Racing for Charity". Mr. Lee gave an introduction of the Club's history and the Club's contributions to the community of Hong Kong.

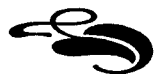
The Club was given the charter by Government to operate the only form of legalized gambling in Hong Kong. Last year the betting duty paid to Government amounted to \$12 billion, representing 10.5% of Government's total tax revenue. Without this source of income the tax rates in Hong Kong would have to be increased significantly to support the current public expenditure.

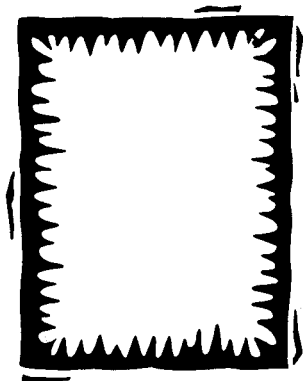
Horse racing is a way of life in Hong Kong with over one million people taking part every race meeting. Being a non-profit making organization, the Club donates all its surplus to charity and over \$1 billion was donated last year. Some of the major charity and community projects supported by the Club are the Ocean Park, HK University of Science & Technology, the Academy for Medicine, Castle Peak Mental Hospital, the Jockey Club Scholarship. Due to the economic downturn, many charitable organizations including Community Chest have difficulties in raising funds for supporting their services and the demand and need for the Jockey Club's support have increased significantly.

Rtn Kishu asked Mr. Lee about the impact on the Club and its charitable donations if the downward trend of turnover continued. Mr. Lee responded that the Club had been putting in a lot of efforts in containing its costs in order to maximize the amount available for charity and on the revenue side he urged everyone in Hong Kong to help in combating illegal gambling in order to stop the drain of leisure dollar to the illegal operators.

Rtn Malcolm thanked the speaker. He praised the Club's contributions to the Hong Kong community and admitted that he had made no contribution to the turnover of the Jockey Club.

The meeting ended with a toast to the Rotary Clubs of Hong Kong, Tai Po, HK Harbour and Kowloon Northeast.

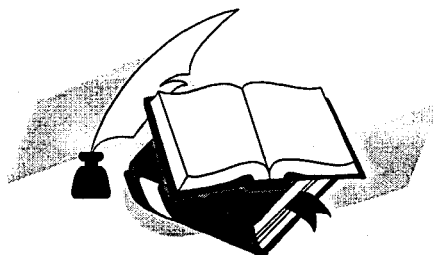

## *President Ravizza cautions against unapproved extension to China*

In response to Rotarian interest in forming clubs in the People's Republic of China, RI President Carlo Ravizza is cautioning clubs and individual Rotarians to follow RI policy, which mandates that extension into countries without Rotary clubs requires the approval of the RI Board.

"The Board has established specific criteria that must be met before it can approve attempts to establish the first Rotary club in a country, including receiving the 'express and concrete approval' of the government," the president said in a message that appears in the August issue of "The Rotarian" magazine. "RI leaders have met with Chinese officials several times over the past 10 years, but the government has not yet approved the establishment of Rotary clubs there." Extension is allowed in the special territories of Hong Kong and Macau where Rotary clubs have been active for some time.

Indicating that he hopes an agreement will eventually be reached with the Chinese government, President Ravizza reminded Rotarians that, in the meantime, a violation of RI policy on this issue could result in disciplinary action, up to and including the revocation of the club's charter. He encouraged clubs that want to extend Rotary service to China to do so through officially sanctioned RI and Rotary Foundation programs, such as Helping Grants and PolioPlus Partners.

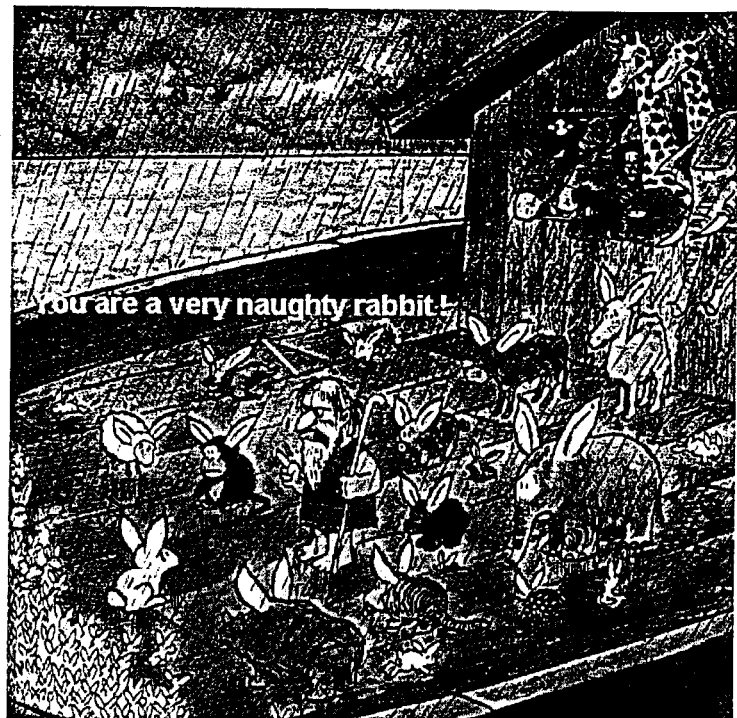
## LAUGHS FOR THE WEEK:
