PP Eddy Wong then introduced our guest speaker for today Dr. Ben Tay and his topic of "Preventing and overcoming chronic pain problems".

Dr. Tay has practised medicine in England, the United States, Hong Kong and in China. He earned his medical degree from the University of Wales in the United Kingdom and became specialist in anaesthesia in 1992.

Subsequently he completed his residency focusing on anesthesia and pain management at the University of Texas. He then continued with further specialization in Pain Medicine and then did further research as Fellow in Pain Medicine at one of the United States foremost medical centers - the University of Texas Science Center /M.D. Anderson Cancer Center in 1995 where he obtained specialty training in non surgical diagnosis and treatment of pain conditions such as chronic pain and cancer pain.

His treatment of pain condition emphasizes on the diagnosis and non-surgical treatment of headaches, back, neck pain and joint pain including chronic pain. He conducts ongoing research in the field for publication. In addition to lecturing in Hong Kong, Dr. Tay has served as an adjunct Professor at the Chinese University of Hong Kong; has had his research presented internationally, and has had his papers published in peer international journals in the areas of pain management and anesthesia. Please welcome Dr Tay.

Dr. Ben Tay presentation of pain treatment was as follows:

- Pain treatment remains challenging as there were many misconceptions of pain and the diagnosis. This is because pain was experienced & felt but could not seen even under MRI like air. Usually in most pain problems no apparent explainable causes are found. MRI and X-rays findings have been mistakenly attributed and assumed to be accurate in locating the causes of pain. This has led to misdiagnosis and treatment with no improvement and recurrence. Consequently many pain conditions are commonly misdiagnosed, under treated and remain challenging.
- In many pain conditions uncontrolled persistent muscle spasm are always significant components & causes at presenting pain sites. These are commonly and the first to be treated. But they are always caused by pain sources at remote locations and structures. Consequently these pain sites continue to recur, spread and usually lead to the need for constant treatment.
- Pain conditions are usually made of the pain source and several secondary pain problem sites. The pain source causes and gives rise to the secondary pain sites.
- Identification and diagnosis of the source of the pain is important. If only the pain sites are treated leaving the pain source undiagnosed, the pain source will provoke the secondary sites to recur and even spread.
- As the problems stem from identification of the pain sources, a definitive approach of identifying the sources of the pain is needed: To find the pain sources accurately, diagnostic block tests with local anaesthetics can provide precise approaches for diagnosis and to have definitive treatments.
- A "diagnostic block" to suspected structures of pain sources provides modeling test to predict the response of the pain problem to the treatment procedure. The diagnostic block is carried out safely and comfortably under sedation guided by x-ray for accurate placement of local anaesthetic at the suspected structure (such as a joint or epidural space) that the doctor believed to be the source of or mediating the pain. The doctor then accurately place a small volume of local anesthetic to temporarily anesthetize or "block" the pain function of the suspected source . The doctor then monitored the effects of the block to determine if a patient achieved pain relief. If the presenting pain sites, tenderness and muscle spasm and dysfunction in remote regions are improved in function with pain reduction, then the source is likely identified. Definitive treatments can then be formulated.

After Dr. Tay gave an interesting talk, there were very warm response and questions from the floor, such as for spot injury etc. PE Nancy presented the souvenir and a photo to our guest speaker and thanked him in our usual Rotary manners.

To formally thank the speaker, we have Rtn Dr. Tony, who echoed PP Nick Pirie's appeal that leprosy patients were suffering from no-pain, but with disfigurement which was an even more dreadful situation. Regarding the topic of pain, Rtn Dr. Tony was delighted to meet with Dr. Tay, whose written articles on pain treatment was widely published. Rtn Dr. Tony could not agree more to Dr. Tay that X-ray was a mere 2-dimensional image graphic whereas the patient was an 3-dimensional human whom we cared.

Rtn Dr. Tony praised Dr Tay's approach for tracing the primary pain (the root problem) as there was a Chinese saying warning against pain site treatment only (頭痛醫頭 · 腳痛醫腳). Rtn Dr. Tony admitted that we were still in an imperfect world, that there might not be a perfect solution to all pains, yet he welcomed the joint efforts from many, including Dr. Tay to contribute to the knowledge and treatment of pains.

PE Nancy adjourned the luncheon meeting on time, she invited the guests and members to make a toast to RI coupled with RC Hong Kong South, Bombay and Bombay Central. The guests and members were requested to stay on for a group photo.

President Eric Sharing his Strategy and Experience in the Rotaract Advisor Forum

Immediate after the service in the Mid-Autumn Festival Home visit of Elderly Singleton in the morning on Sept 10, President Eric proceeded to the Rotary District Open Forum for Presidents and Rotaract Advisors on "How To Make An Effective Rotaract Club" in City University in the afternoon. There were 50+ attendees including DG David, DGE Kenneth, DGN Eugene, New Generation Chair PDG Tony and many district officers, Presidents, Rotaract Advisors. President Eric was invited to share his experience in reactivating our com-based Rotaract Club and empowering the Lingnan University Student Union Rotaract Club. He first demonstrated a 3 minutes video and 2 minutes slide show to draw attentions of all audiences the tactics he used since June 2010. President Eric also emphasized the importance of the three pillars for successful club development, i.e. Loyalty, Discipline and Communication.

After the event, PP Sally Ho, Project in charge sent ccongratulations to President Eric and our club for reactivating the Rotaract Club in a very successful way. Forty volunteers included Rotarians from the club, Rotaractors, friends and families and students from Holy Carpenter Secondary School (our New Adoption a School Partner) gathered at the Kindness Centre, People's Food Bank at St. James' Settlement in Shek Kip Mei. The briefing and registration started at 9am. Person In Charge, IT Chair Anthony Kwong started with summary of the event. Pres. Eric welcomed and gave a briefing afterward. Ms. Joey Tsang gave the final briefing of the items require extra attention during the home visit, such as the topics can or cannot be discussed during the interview, ask for the permission before talking photos.
