Rtn. Stacy had a pleasure duty to introduce the speaker of the luncheon.

Ms Ocean Whitehawk was from UK and had been our speaker before, and with more than 20 years experience on self development training, one-on-one as well as insightful group study programs. Ms Whitehawk was author to a few books including Juicy Woman and The Simple Truth.

Ms Whitehawk talked about the right brain as being creative and intuitive. She then explained how to harness the innate creative power, and to change the personal life. Ms Whitehawk explained about the theory behind a book of Healing Power of Sound, by Jeffrey Thompson, and she was kind enough to bring along quite a few quartz crystal bowls to demonstrate her belief regarding the healing power of sounds, for relaxation, sound healing and other vibrational practices.

Before her demonstration of those powerful acoustic vibration, she gave a few illustrations of 'Shaping your life through your silent and spoken words' that kind words can give encouragement and with lasting effects:

- Words can comfort, inspire and heal
- Words can cut deep and leave unseen and long lasting scars.

Ms Whitehawk gave examples of the positive words (such as I can, I will, I believe etc.) that can create vibration, with more possibility, expanding, energetic and showing commitment. Ms Whithawk also gave examples for not so positive words (such as I can't, I don't, I won't, etc.) that might bring negative connotations.

In short, Ms Whitehawk talked about the words being seeds for future, just as one person sowed so they would reap thereafter, and a person would probably get what he or she spoke about. For an exercise, Ms Whitehawk used 'How are you?' as a greeting to see how the audience would reply. There were many positive responses such as good, great, fabulous, fantastic, marvelous, excellent, etc.

Ms Whitehawk summarized her views saying each sound (word) was supposed to be creative, with a vibration potency to be either constructive or destructive, for timely and loving words to give a symphony of harmony and for the careless and cruel words to cause distress. Therefore Ms Whitehawk suggested the audience to avoid negative words from the daily speech. And also to invite new words into the vocabulary, that for the person who to speak, the speech would serve as a mirror of the soul.

Ms Whitehawk brought along a few quartz crystal bowls in different sizes and tuned to different musical notes. They ranged in size from 6-20 inches up. Generally, the smaller the bowl the higher the "pitch" and the larger the bowl the deeper the "pitch". The crystal bowls were made different colors by the inclusion of precious minerals or different types of crystals such as rose quartz, moldavite, and selenite. Some of them could be as expensive as US\$4,000 to US\$5,000. To further experiment of the sounds, Ms Whitehawk asked the audience to sit back, relax and close their eyes, to allow the sound vibration to echo into their minds.

Rtn. Sharon formally thanked our speaker in the usual Rotary manners, grateful for her taking the time and effort to show us her work of humanity.

For the next week meeting, it would be the first club assembly for the directors and project chairpersons to report on the progress of club project activities. IPP Nancy proposed a toast to RI coupled with RC of Hong Kong Northwest. The meeting was adjourned in time and the guests and members were invited to stay for a group photo.

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
