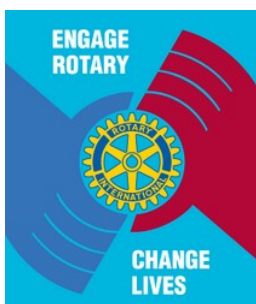
Last Week's Proceedings – 2nd October, 2013

He reported that the Makati North Rotary club will surely visit us in 2014 when we will celebrate our 60th Anniversary.

Part 2: Reported by PP Norman on the BBQ dinner for Uncle Peter. We are going to have a BBQ dinner on Oct. 25, 2013 at the Deep Water Bay Golf Club. This function is an annual fellowship event to allow members to have more time to wine and dine in a more casual format. Part 3: Rtn. Joseph made a presentation on the Holly Carpenter’s project requesting funding from HKIE. Rtn. Joseph presented the Conversion Plan of the Multi-Media Language Centre of the SKH Holy Carpenter Secondary School. He cited some background of this school. The Multi-Media Language Centre(MMLC) has been used for more than ten years.

- Both hardware and software provided by the Education Bureau are not compatible with the current information technology world.
- There are big demands for the LESS PRIVILEGED group students looking for chances to LEARN AND PRACTISE their spoken language.
- MMLC is not just for learning language, it is also for learning multimedia skill, it needs higher specific and flexible device (Laptop computer) to fulfill the demand.
- The current Education System requires:
 - Interactive Teaching
 - Open forum for discussion amongst students.
 - Group-work display
 - Public speaking skill from student.

- Convert MMLC room to a Multi-purpose function room
- Provide students more learning opportunities.

The total budget they require is HK\$300,000. And their proposed completion date of this project is by early April, 2014

Part 4: Report by Uncle George on our 60th Anniversary venue. PP George reported that planning for our 60th Anniversary Celebration is going on well for April 5, 2014 . The organizing committee will keep to the budget set by the board. Our preliminary plans are:

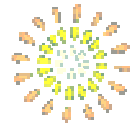
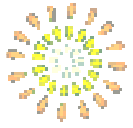

觀塘 Fat Fat Restaurant (豐盛餐廳)



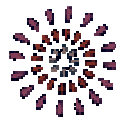

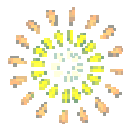
