

Last week's Proceedings -

Then acting Serge ant-at-arm PP Rudy reported the Red Box collection which was amounted to HK\$ 1,100.

PE Heman formally introduced our speaker today, Mr. Ken Ngai. Mr. Ken Ngai Yuen Keung has got over decade solid experience in IT projects and has witnessed the development of contemporary IT infrastructure and architecture as well as the proliferation of internet usages.

Mr Ngai is now the Website Director of The Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups responsible for all technological aspects of the website development for the Groups. Ken launched and implemented eMarketing strategy and solutions for the Groups to reach out to youth over internet.

Ken spotted the behavioral issues of youngsters using internet, and therefore he has launched and actively involved in digital literacy education campaign to youth as well as parents. Ken is, at the same time, the Project Manager for the largest one-year internet education campaign in Hong Kong funded by the Government of Hong Kong. He plans, designs and executes the campaign.

Ken's topic today is: How to communicate better with our kids using the net!

Ken started the talk by sharing an online chatting message between 2 youngsters on a popular chatting website. He explained that this is the common messages nowadays on the net. The new generation is now more open on the Net to strangers. It is subject to a lot of social problems and risks.

He then shared the recent findings in a recent survey on most parents concern. The survey result is listed below for reference.

- Making friends online 48.2%
- Excessive access to internet 45.5%
- -Online pornography 24.9%
- Ille gal download 11%
- Cyberbullying 5.6%

The following are the popular Internet activities:

- MSN with friends
- Browsing internet

- Search engine
- Downloading movies / music
- Socialising online e.g. Facebook, twitter
- Blogging
- Shopping / Auction
- Forum
- Others ?
The new divergence of the Internet usage has developed into the following:
- Knowing friends
- Bullying others
- Sexting
- P2P movie
- P2P porno
- Uploading video-clips
- Gaming
The following are some interesting behavioral phenomena findings:
- 39% have given out personal information (name, e-mail address, age, gender) online (when entering a contest, playing online games or signing up for websites).
- 31% have chatted or used IM with someone on the Internet that they have not met face to face?
- 12% have met a new person from the Internet face to face?
- 13% are willing to meet face to face with someone new they meet on the Internet.
- 8% say that, while on the Internet, some one has asked them to keep their friendship a secret.
- 53% have seen something on the Internet that shouldn't be on the Internet.
- 64% know of or have heard about other students who have done something on the Internet that shouldn't be done.
All in all, Ken gives us the following useful tips when dealing with our kids' Internet usage problems:
- Keep open dialogue with children about their internet activities. Encourage them to notice you when encountering problem.
- Set internet usage rules such as
Access time, and frequencyUsage
- Place computer set at open and common area.
- Observe and remind children what information can be placed on internet. Note: internet is not a private but a public area
- Discuss with children internet-related of fence cases
- Do not let children be the system administrator too early.
Ken has given us such an informational talk which is very useful for parents nowadays. PP Rudy has shared his personal experience of his relationship with his daughter through the Internet.

Rotary Potpourri

Message from TRF Trustee Chair Glenn E. Estess, Sr.

On 24th October, we mark World Polio Day. It is a time to reflect on the progress we have made and to strengthen our resolve for the work ahead. It is a time to raise awareness of our efforts to eradicate polio, and to help meet Rotary's US\$200 Million Challenge.

We have come a long way. We have reduced the number of polio cases by over 99 percent, from more than 350,000 a year in the 1980 to about 1,650 in 2008. We have brought the number of endemic countries from 125 to 4. And we have vaccinated over two billion children.

We are proud of these accomplishments, and we are closer than ever to achieving our goal of worldwide eradic ation. But we must recognize that our greatest enemy is complacency. We cannot slacken our efforts now, because as long as there is wild polio virus anywhere, the disease can easily spread again. The number of cases in endemic countries is down this year, but the number of cases in countries where polio has been reintroduced has increased significantly - a reminder of how polio knows no borders, and how vigilant we must remain.

Polio is still endemic in Afghanistan, India, Nigeria and Pakistan. Difficult terrain, civil unrest, remote settlements, poor sanitation, and terrible poverty are just some of the obstacles to immunization. But we, and our partners in the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, are determined to continue our work with persistence and creativity.

I have been inspired by the incredible strides already made this year: In one 10-day period, a total of 222,270,331 children in 22 countries were immunized against polio. The effort and the commitment are phenomenal. This is a testament to the resolve that has brought us this far - and that will soon bring us to our goal of complete eradic ation.




