What Happened Last Week

President Desmond opened the meeting by warmly welcoming Rtn. Murray MacDonald, an ex-member of our Club.

Our birthday boy Rtn. Francis asked PP David to lead the birthday song and received the birthday present from President Desmond.

Rtn Bernie Ting from Hong Kong South was invited to make an announcement about their 888 raffle tickets for fund raising. Rtn Murray then spoke and told us about his retirement life in New Zealand. PP John Kwok reminded members to note the new "absentees list" in the bulletin and to let him know should there be any mistake. He also announced that PDG Peter Trophy golf tournament would be held on 19 November.

The acting Sergeant at Arms, Rtn Rudy announced that there were 29 members present and that \$1590 had been collected.

IPP CY gave Rotary information and he reminded members the very basic things in Rotary - the four way test!

PP Tim then introduced the guest speaker, Rtn Gerard McMahon who was formerly Executive Director of the Security and Future Commission and is now running his own firm advising listed companies on corporate governance. He is also sitting on the board of many large corporations like Sun Hung Kei and Hong Kong Chinese Bank. The title of his talk was "Stock Exchange - 2000 Onwards".

Rtn Gerard first outlined the drawbacks in the present set up of the Stock Exchange; inefficient decision making -a board of 31 directors, slow in employing technologies due to resistance from the small brokers, not competitive with a minimum commission rate of .0.25 per cent. The Stock Exchange was run more like a private club, making it difficult for government to monitor and regulate.

Rtn Gerard then highlighted the improvements that would be brought along by the merger of the Stock Exchange, Future Exchange and the Clearing House. The new body after the merge would be operated as a commercial concern, hence would have professional management, clear accountabilities and transparency. There would be 24 hours trading, better listing requirements and other technology improvements. It would also be easier for the SFC to check the compliance of and to enforce the rules.

Rtn Gerard was confident that when the improvements were implemented Hong Kong's position as the major financial centre in the region and the world would be secured and it would be difficult for Shanghai and Singapore to over take us in the foreseeable future. He was thanked by PP Rob.

Rtn Malcolm announced that he would give his vocational talk next week.

Sunger-alleviation effort nets seven young Paul Sarris Sellows

Seven young people who raised more than US\$10,000 for a Rotary hunger-relief effort based in Texas, USA, have received Paul Harris Fellow recognition for their outstanding contributions. Each member of the group, which consists of three Rotaractors and four Interactors, raised at least \$1,000 as part of the Children Feeding Children campaign, an outgrowth of Lubbock, Texas-based Hunger Plus.

Hunger Plus is a collaboration of all nine Rotary districts in Texas that helps needy residents of Chihuahua, Mexico. The effort involves the production and shipment of dehydrated food as well as the dissemination of information about efficient food production.


Children Feeding Children was established by Rotarians in District 5840 as a way to get young people involved in Hunger Plus. Rotaractors and Interactors were encouraged to find ways to raise money to help fund the various aspects of Hunger Plus, which includes the support of a non-profit food dehydration plant in Lubbock that can process 500,000 pounds of food per week.

"It has really inspired the young people because they see how they can affect other peoples' lives," said Sharon Massey, secretary of the Rotary Club of Fredericksburg-Morning and the 1998-99 district Rotaract and Interact chairperson.

The young people raised money quickly in a variety of ways, including penny drives and car washes. The Interactors convinced school administrators to allow them to hold a "cap day" in which students, who are not allowed to wear caps in school, could buy the right to wear a cap for a day. In less than two months' time, the overall effort had generated \$10,600.

The district decided to give the students a special honour by including the money that they raised in the district's giving to The Rotary Foundation's Annual Programs Fund, thus entitling them to Paul Harris Fellow recognition. District Governor William Dean then pledged \$10,600 in District Designated Funds to Hunger Plus.

The seven young people honoured include: Brittney Chiu and Nikki Montondon of the Rotaract Club of South West Texas State University; Carol Rhodes of the Rotaract Club of Texas Lutheran University; Ryan Bowman and Julie Farahani of the Interact club of Tivy High School, Kerrville; Sarah Eckert of the Interact Club of Fredericksburg High School; and Jennifer Daniels of the Interact Club of Del Rio High School, Del Rio. Also receiving Paul Harris Fellow recognition was Julie Anderson, sponsor of the Del Rio High School club. All received Paul Harris Fellow certificates at the district conference in May and were honoured separately in front of their own clubs in the ensuring weeks.


... and here's one from me:


