Last week's Proceedings -

29th October, 2010

The 17th Meeting of the RCHKIE was held on a Friday night and it was a special event designated as the Ladies nite cum Rotaract Club of Hong Kong Island East Installation. President Heman rang the bell at 7:35pm with 11 of our own members were in attendance, President Belinda Yeung of RC of Hong Kong Harbour has lead 8 other members (PE Polly Yeung, PP Eddie Leung, PP Grace Yen, PP Samuel Chung, IPP Eddie Wong, W. T. Wong, Antonio Chu, and Douglas) to join our meeting. Amongst the District officers, there were PDG Tony Wong, DRC PP Wendy Mung, DRR Anita Chan. Rotarianne Olivia Kan, Angela Wu, Isa Hall and Christine Wu along with their family members and guests Ivan Chin, Winnie Wong and Brian To were also in the attendance list. Five out of the six new members of the Rotaract Club of HKIE including Pres. Knox Tang, Suki Yan, Angus Yiu, Kathy Ng and Sarah Li have attended for their official installation ceremony. Pres. Mini Ng of Rotaract Club of Lingnan University has lead Ng Suen Lam, Asther Lau and Carol Chan to join this meeting to support. Last but not least, there is our frequent visiting Rotarian, Ms. Joanne Li of RC of St. Ives, Australia.

President Heman started the meeting by welcoming back PE Eric who had just won two Bronze Medals in the 4th World Traditional Wushu Championship in China.

PE Eric, as one of the 42 members in the Hong Kong, China Athletes Team, won two Bronze Medals in Tai Chi Chuan and Tai Chi Sabres in the 4th Traditional World Wushu Championships held in ShiYan City(near Wudang), HuBei Province, China in 17 -19 October 2010. There are over 2000 athletes from 82 countries participating. The competition held every 2 years and attracted both local and oversea athletes who are keen in Wushu travelled for a long distances to the event as a cultural exchange activity and testing of their own achievement in an international level. The extremely high standard of the level of the athletes were judged by 7 adjudicators with recognized national level in Wushu during the competition. The event is similar to a mini-Olympic games in Wushu. Hong Kong China Team won 13 Gold Medals and 40 + Silver and Bronze and was ran ked 2nd Runner Ups in Medals Achievement following Russia and China.

There was no birthday member attending the meeting today.

President Heman then proceeded with his announcements:

1. Due to Typhoon Megi and bad weather, District Golf Tournament has been rescheduled to 5 November at the Old Course, Hong Kong Golf Club, Fanling. If anyone is interested in joining please let me know.

President Heman then invited PE Eric to brief about the upcoming District 10km race on Nov. 7, 2010. RC of HKIE together with the Rotaract Club of HKIE and family members have formed 6 teams to run in the race.

President Heman then passed the floor to President Knox to conduct the installation for Rotaract Club of HKIE. President Knox introduced the MC Sarah and Angus of the installation. They started by showing the video of their members and the planned projects.

President Knox made the very first speech as the President of Rotaract Club of HKIE. President Knox shared the process in the past 6 months, with the great assistance from PP Andy Wong, PE Eric Chin and Pres. Heman, the Rotaract Club of HKIE is now re-activated with 6 new members.

PDG Tony Wong was then invited to give a speech. PDG Tony described that Pres. Knox is a piece of white paper, so there would be much room to write on. He further emphasized that Youth Service is the most important amongst the five avenues of services. We should spend more effort to strengthen our Rotaract Clubs which is the future of Rotary.

President Knox then introduced all the new members one by one before inviting Pres. Heman to give his speech.

President Heman mentioned that PE Eric and PP Andy have played a vital part in the reform of our Rotaract Club of HKIE. While PE Eric was the mastermind behind this whole project, PP Andy had provided much guidance all along. President Heman quoted the Mottos of Rotaract Club: Fellowship through services; To serve to learn and to live. On behalf of the RC of HKIE, President Heman congratulated the whole team of the Rotaract Club of HKIE for the successful installation.

DRC PP Wendy Mung was invited to witness the official installation of President Knox and all the Directors. Group photos for all board members, advisors and District officials were taken.

Sec. Suki and Dir. Kathy then introduced their year plan which included the following service projects:

SAA PP Rudy announced the Red Box intake at \$2,200 which included the special contribution of HK\$1,000 from Pres. Belinda Yeung of RC of Hong Kong Harbour.

The meeting was declared closed at 8:25PM after a toast to RI coupled with all the Rotary Clubs attend the meeting. Buffet dinner started right the way.

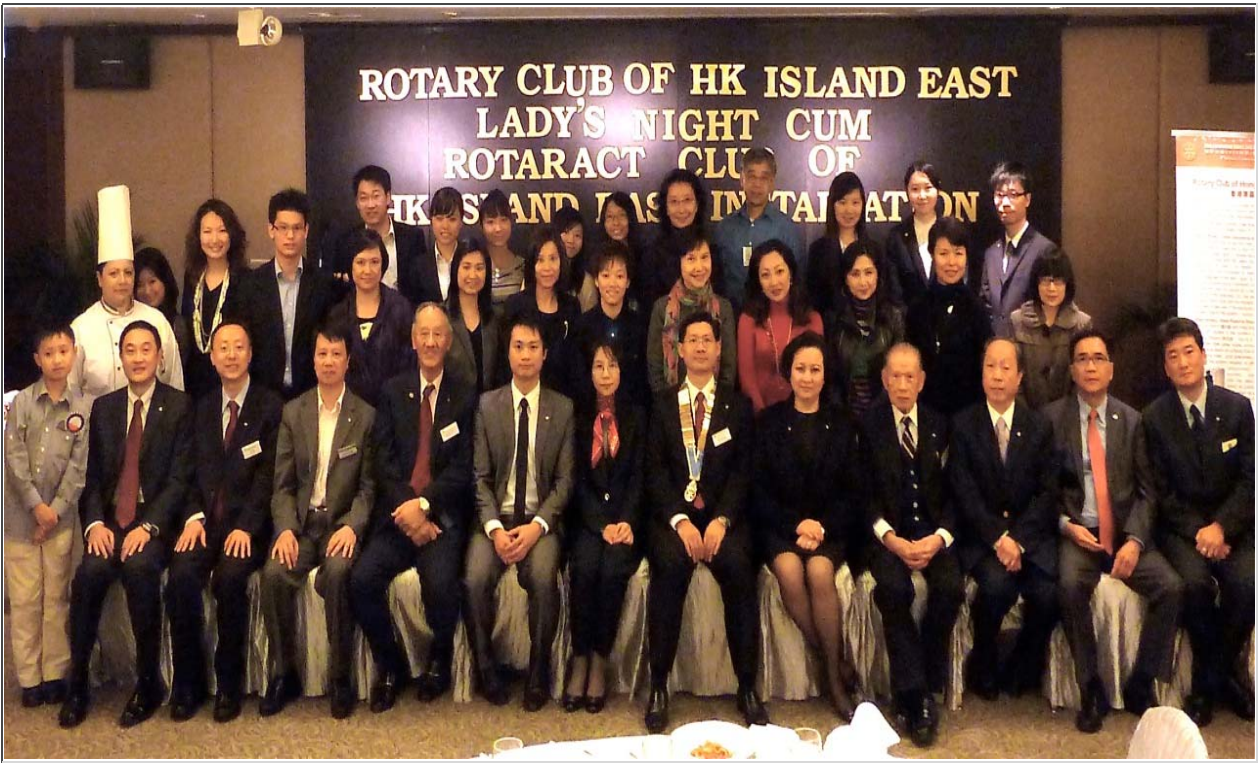
