IPP Nancy Yee then introduced our speaker for today. Our speaker is the Master Vintner Mr. Garry Benny of Frames Bellavista Winery Hong Kong Ltd. The subject of his talk is "Your Personal Wine Making Experience".

Mr. Benny started his talk by telling us a little about his company followed by the details about personal wine making experience. His talk was summarized as follow:

The Frames Bellavita Winery is brand new in Hong Kong to help you make wine your own way. We have been helping people make their own wine since 1998. We have an on-site Master Vintner who will teach you the art of winemaking and guide you through the entire process from selecting your wine, customizing it to your taste, and then bottling, labeling and sealing your wine. Best of all, you do not need any special equipment, as it is all done right here at The Frames Bellavita Winery (MY Wine).

The Frames Bellavita Winery (MY Wine) selects and imports grape from the best vineyards around the world. Merlot and Chardonnay from France, Amarone and Valpolicella from Italy, Pinotage from South Africa, Shiraz from Australia – to name just a few of the hundreds of wines that you can make by yourself at The Frames Bellavita Winery (MY Wine). We also import fruit wine concentrates such as Peach, Strawberry, Açaí, and Green Apple to make refreshing low-alcohol fruit wines. You may also choose to make wine like Canadian Ice Wine, Port, or Sherry. Made with ALL NATURAL ingredient - no chemicals or additives!

At The Frames Bellavita Winery (MY Wine), we will teach you the entire wine making process on our premise – you will discuss with our Master Vintner about the type of wine you like, then pick a wine kit, hydrate the concentrated grape juice using crystal-clear reverse osmosis water, add yeast to it, and you are almost done.

In about five to six weeks, depending on the type of wine that you are making, your wine will be ready for the final stages -- bottling, corking, labeling and sealing. You may put on your choice of a generic or custom-made wine label (check out our Private Label for design ideas!). These steps will take less than an hour and they are easy and FUN!

Most wine kits will make thirty 750mL bottles of delicious wine. You may choose to consume them right away, however, we recommend that you wait a month or two for better tasting. The taste of our premium red wines will keep improving for six months or more after bottling.

Pres. Jonathan then asked PP George Leung to come up to thank the speaker. PP George said that this was the most interesting talk for this year and he suggested we make a vocational trip to the Winery to learn more about this business. He gave a big thank you to Mr. Garry Benny for such an interesting talk.




