

Last week's Proceedings -

12th November, 2008

We were back to our regular Wednesday luncheon meeting for this week.

Our President Andy kicked off the meeting at 1:10 p.m., a bit early to allow for a long programme for the day. He then welcomed back our member Dr. Eric Chin from his holiday in China.

We had Mr. Lee Kai Kwong, the Principal of Choi Chun School as our guest.

Our President Andy made the following announcements:

- 4. The District Bowling Competition will be held on 4 January 2009

- 6. PDG Jason Yeung will come to visit our Club in December.

Hon Treasurer Rudy reported a total collection of \$1,600 for the Red-Box.

The birthday boys for the week were our PP Tim Lui and Dr. Eric Chin. The birthday song was led by another two Doctors Hubert Chan and Rudy Law.

Then there was a cheque presentation to the principal of Choi Chun School, Mr. Lee Kai Kwong, for the Bakery project. Mr. Lee asked for support of the members to place order for the cookies and cakes at a very reasonable price and left some ordering form with our club.

Then the highlight of the day was the talk by our member Colin Chau.

Colin worked in UBS as a private banker and his talk was on Wealth Management.

He mentioned that the concept of wealth management had been around for many years and gradually became more systematic over the past 200 years due to development of legislation on inheritance.

In his presentation, it was mentioned that wealth management focused on needs and goals for an individual who centered on family, business and personal aspect in life. Examples were used to illustrate how the role of wealth management facilitated meeting the needs and goals.

A brief introduction on platform offered by private banking was highlighted to demonstrate the services available to deliver holistic solutions. The recent case on Lehman's mini bond was also addressed where the rationale behind the downfall of Lehman was shared as well as views on government intervention were discussed.

Questions were raised after the presentation and answers were provided, e.g. how much wealth that we need before a private banker is needed for your wealth management, etc.

President Andy thanked Colin for his informative talk and then closed the meeting at 2:00 p.m. sharp and proposing a toast to RI coupled with the RC of Hong Kong Island East.
