She said that the school was established in 1933 with a location to support the community in the New England area. Students come from various locations of the world such as China, Japan, Hong Kong, United Kingdom and Germany. Total student number was less than 250 in 2001.

In the United States, there were only about 10% of the students in boarding school. Traditionally, students in boarding schools were male, and wealthy children. Nowadays, since boarding schools provided a variety of options to children: their small class size, and strong academic programs gave the students a strong competitive edge. Boarding school provided a stable environment to the students because sometimes some of their parents had to work with high mobility.

On the other hand, parents also perceived boarding schools had less school violence and drug problems since there had close relationship between teachers and students. Also parents had become a partner with the school to work with their children. This partnership relationship also gave training to parents.

In particular, Millbrook School provided leadership programs to students inside and outside the classroom. The school believed students could find valuable teams and peers during their school days there. The school provided 24 hours academic, sport, and art learning environment for students to learn. They were free from distractions.

PDG YK thanked the speaker as his daughter was studying in Millbrook. He also used Rtn. Sam, an alumni, as a good reference for us.

President Chris then ended the meeting by proposing a toast to the Rotary Club of Walton-on-the-Thame. He reminded us on next week's meeting: the Club Assembly Meeting.

The PolioPlus Programme

In 1985, Rotary launched PolioPlus, one of the most ambitious humanitarian programme ever undertaken by a private entity. PolioPlus was in large part the catalyst for the World Health Assembly's adoption in 1988 of the goal of polio eradication. Rotary takes pride in its commitment to help achieve a polio-free world by 2005.

To-day, thanks to Rotary and its global partners, the world is on the threshold of eradicating the poliovirus that has destroyed so many lives and hope. Polio cases have dropped by 99.8 percent since 1988. More than two billion children have been immunized, and four million spared death or paralysis. The biggest obstacle to victory in the battle against polio is financial. Despite the enormous resources already committed, more money is urgently needed to buy vaccine and to deliver it to children in the few remaining countries where the poliovirus still circulates. To help close the funding gap, Rotary has announced a new, one-year polio eradication fundraising campaign. Our goal is US\$80 million, in donations and pledges, by 30 June 2003.

Help fulfill our promise of polio eradication by 2005. Join your fellow Rotarians in the race to reach the last child. Remember that just two precious drops of oral polio vaccine can save that child from lifelong paralysis. Let's finish the job we promised to complete. Let's eradicate the dreaded disease of polio, the world's greatest cause of disability. Together, we can deliver to all children everywhere a lasting and special gift: a world free of polio. Your gift is needed. US\$100 buys 1200 doses of polio vaccine for children. US\$500 helps to deliver vaccine house to house, in an entire village. US\$1,000 provides laboratory equipment essential to surveillance systems.




