Pres. Andy then reminded us to register early for attending the upcoming 40th Anniversary of our sister club the Rotary Club of Osaka Jonan from 28th to 31st of May 2009 held in Osaka Japan.

Hon. Treasurer PP Rudy made his report for the Red Box Donation with the amount totaling HK\$1,500 including a handsome contribution from PDG Dr. Jason Yeung.

Then came the highlight of today's meeting with PDG Dr. Jason Yeung being formally introduced by our Hon. Sec. Heman for his topic about the "Childhood Injury Prevention" program.

Before the presentation PDG Jason recalled the many happy moments he and his club have had with our club including the coorganization of the District Conference in the year when our PP Tim Lui was the President of our club. The District Conference was held the first time in Shenzhen with record breaking attendance of participants that year and a number of renowned dignitaries from the state and provincial government of the People of Republic of China.

Purpose of the Childhood Inquiry Prevention program

1. To put forward a proposal for a public education campaign on "Childhood Injury Prevention", the top priority agenda of both Rotary International District 3450 and Hong Kong Paediatric Foundation.

2 To solicit your support to turn this meaningful program into reality.

Background

1 Accidental injury is the leading cause of childhood mortality in developed countries.

2 In Hong Kong, accidental injury puts more children in hospital than any other diseases. In 1998 alone, accidental injuries accounted for approximately 76% of total traumatic injuries, among which home accidents contributes to over 50% of the total accidental injury in Hong Kong.*

Tactics #2 <10 Hazards of Childhood Injury at Home Survey>

Purpose

* Establish local data on the high risk traps of childhood injury at home, which paves the way for the "Childhood Injury Prevention Home Audit Education Program" to be launched at the school sector.

Survey Methodology

*Questionnaires will be mailed to 50 kindergartens and primary schools to solicit parents' feedback.

Target sample size

* 1,000 parents with children aged below 10.

Questionnaire Design

- (1) "10 hazards of childhood injury at home".
- Understanding
- Attitude
- Behavior (Whether they have done any home audit on a regular basis)
- (2) Pre valence data:
- Incidence of childhood injury at home vs. the incidence of diseases
- Types
- Causes
- Impact: physiological and psychological

Tactics #3 <10 Hazards of Childhood Injury at Home Survey> Press Conference

Presenters and Content

- (1) Rotary representatives: The launch of the "Childhood Injury Prevention, I pledge! " Program
- (2) HKPF representative: The "10 Hazards of Childhood Injury at Home Survey Report" and recommendations.
- (3) Rotary representatives who are parents: To share their experience of childhood injury at home.

Tactic #4 Childhood Injury Prevention Home Audit Education Program

To encourage parents to conduct home audit to minimize childhood injury.

A "Home Audit" leaflet/ bookmark etc. developed by Rotary and HKPF.

Education seminars to be organized at primary schools and community centres.

Rotarians' role:

- a) Upon development of the template for the seminar (such as presentation materials), different Rotary Clubs can organize their community education seminars.
- b) Ride on the Home Audit direction, the Rotarians can initiate their community activities, such as
- -- Establish a Home Audit team to provide Home Audit advice to the underprivileged families

- -- Organize Home Audit exhibition/carnival
- -- Organize Home Audit story telling competition or painting competition for primary schools, etc

Rotary Potpourri

A Brief History of PDG John Yuen HK Island East Rotary Scholarship Fund

Since we have two Ambassadorial Scholars, viz., Ms Ting Chen and Ms Winnie Mok served as guest speakers of our club recently, it is appropriate to outline a short history of this Endowment Fund in The Rotary Foundation.

Most of you are aware that PDG John Yuen was the Founding President of our Club in 1954 and he had been a great source of inspiration to our club during his time as a Rotarian.

Upon the death of the late PDG John Yuen in 8th November 1989, his family members donated a sum of HK\$1,000,000.00 to our club to identify a project in his permanent memory.

A committee was set up, he aded by PDG Peter Hall, to look for the right project. A number of community service projects were suggested for the approval of the family of PDG John Yuen, but none were approved. Eventually, our board of directors considered a most suitable project as to set up an endowment fund with The Rotary Foundation in perpetual memory of our Founder as follows:

PDG John Yuen HK Island East Scholarship Fund.

This suggestion was met with the entire approval of the committee.

In order to meet with the requirement of The Rotary Foundation for a major gift of such a nature, a total of US\$150,000.00 should be raised. The Yuen family made no hesitation and made up the remaining balance which total was in excess of the plagued HK Dollars One Million.

In the year 1993, when Rtn. Tim Lui was the President of our club, this cheque for USD150,000.00 was presented at the Asia Zone 4 Institute in Seoul, Republic of Korea, to Past RI president Raja Saboo, trustee of the Rotary Foundation. The interest earned will be for a selected scholarship while the capital is untouched, yielding further accumulated interest.

After all these years, the market value of our original gift of US\$150,000.00 rose to US\$235,542.39 as of 31st March 2008.

The Rotary Foundation will look for suitable candidate, such as Ambassadorial Scholars according to the interest/profit available for such applications.

We hope the global financial tsunami will not affect any earnings at all.

And with that, he emptied a bucket of horse manure onto my hallway carpet.


If this vacuum cleaner does not remove all traces of this horse manure from your carpet, Madam, I will personally eat the remainder.'


