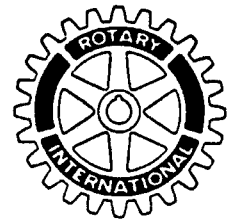

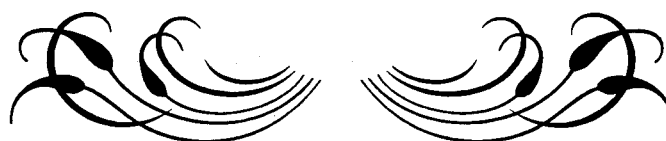

Rotary Information

President-nominee, six directors-nominee declared

RI President Carlo Ravizza has declared Richard D. King to be the sole official nominee for president of Rotary International for 2001-02. No other nominations were forthcoming by the December 1 deadline.

King is a member of the Rotary Club of Niles (Fremont), California, USA. He was selected for the top RI position by the Nominating Committee for President of RI in September and will be elected at the June 2000 Convention in Buenos Aires, Argentina. King will succeed Frank Devlyn of Mexico on July 1, 2001.

At the Buenos Aires convention, new RI directors will be elected from nine of the 34 zones of the Rotary world. They will take office on July 1, 2001, and serve two-year terms. Six candidates selected by zone nominating committees have not been opposed and are assured of election.

In accordance with RI bylaws, Ravizza has declared the six candidates who face no opposition to be the official directors-nominee from their respective zones. They are Toshio Itabshi, Rotary Club of Ashikaga East, Tochigi, Japan (Zone 1); Dong Kurn Lee, Rotary Club of Seoul Hangang, Seou, Korea (Zone 9); Peter Kron, Rotary Club of Salzburg, Austria (Zone 14); Floyd P. Olson, Rotary Club of Gig Harbor, Washington, USA (Zone 23); Gerald A. Meigs, Rotary Club of St. Paul, Minnesota, USA (Zone 27); and James R. Shamblin, Rotary Club South Shreveport, Louisiana, USA (Zone 29).

A challenger has been proposed to the candidate chosen by the nominating committee in Zone 19 and Zone 6 was unable to select a candidate from among nine Rotarians suggested. In each of these two zones, a ballot by mail will determine the director-nominee. The results will not be known until early March 2000. Zone 18 will be selecting a director-nominee in a separate process and the declaration will be made in April 2000.

New Zealand club answers plea for help in Turkey

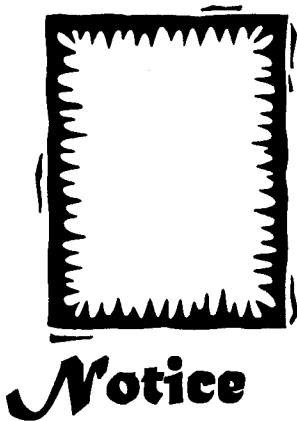
Rotarians in New Zealand have responded to a call for help, issued via the Internet by their counterparts in Istanbul, Turkey, where efforts to aid the survivors of the August 17 earthquake are ongoing. The Rotary Club of Bulls, New Zealand, collected clothing, blankets, and toys and shipped the material to the Rotary Club of Istanbul-Gayrettepe in late November.

The Istanbul club has set up a tent camp that houses 600 people left homeless by the earthquake. Members of the Bulls club were alerted to the camp and its need for assistance by checking the Turkish clubs Web site (www.gayretteperotary.org/).

Lyndon Tamblyn, international director of the Bulls club, coordinated the project. The club procured a large shipping container and made an appeal to the community and other clubs in District 9940 for donations.

Tamblyn also visited Istanbul for four days during a business trip to Europe to survey the relief activities. He met with Rotarians and visited the Rotary camp, which is one of about 200 in the area, and was told that many of those in tent camps would have to live there through the winter until April. Survivors had plenty of food, the children seemed happy, and there was no evidence of disease.

"Everyone is performing well despite the difficulties," Tamblyn said. "I felt really humble to be part of the international aid agencies doing their utmost to help people."

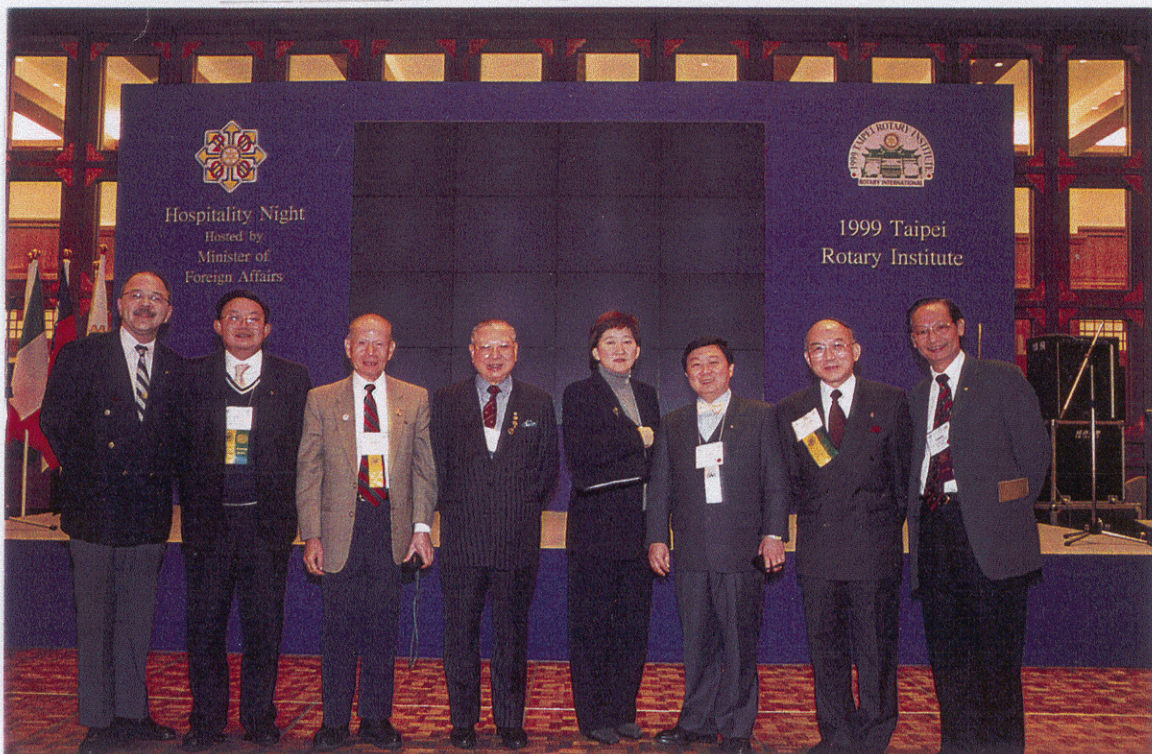
