Chartered on 6 April, 1954 by Charter President PDG (Uncle) John Yuen Uncle Peter led the birthday song for the birthday boys: PP John Luk, VP Henry Chan and Rtn. Heron.

Rtn. Kishu then formally introduced our speaker, IPP Stephen Lam who is the Head of Clinical Genetic Service of the Department of Health. The title of his talk was "Their hearts have not grown old, a genetic view of ageing". According to the UN's definition, elderly is over the age of 60 and the population of elderly is increasing. Social life can be divided into four stages: Childhood/socialisation; Paid work/family raising; Active/independent life beyond working and parenting; and Eventual dependence which naturally is what people would like to defer. Genetic effect only accounts for 27% on ageing and the other 73% is due to environment effects such as diet and bad habits. Leading causes of death are cancer and heart diseases. Health care can certainly help defer ageing. Scientists have also been studying cells for long time and have been testing the manipulation of genes to defer ageing and make human being live longer.

President Stephen thanked the speaker in our usual manner and closed the meeting with a toast to RI coupled with Rotary Clubs of HK Northwest, Peninsula Sunrise and Peninsula South.



Rotary Information

RCCs (Rotary Community Corps), Rotaract & Interact Clubs Grow in the Second Quarter

Rotary's three partners-in-service program - Interact, Rotaract and Rotary Community Corps - registered steady gains in the second quarter of the 2001-2002 Rotary year. For each of the Rotary club - sponsored organizations, growth was strongest in the Asia-Pacific region.

With the chartering of 181 new Interact Clubs, their global tally has reached 8,112, with an estimated membership of 186,570. Rotary clubs in Bulgaria and Romania sponsored their first Interact clubs, bringing the number of countries with clubs to 109.

Organized primarily in secondary schools, Interact clubs promote leadership development and community and international service.

The number of Rotaract clubs worldwide totals 7,165 in 151 countries as the result of the chartering of 126 new clubs in the quarter ending 31 December, 2001. Global membership is estimated at 164,795. The RI Rotaract Committee encourages Rotaract clubs to aim at fulfilling the goals of Rotary's Global Quest for members by having one new member introduced at every meeting. Rotaract clubs provide service and leadership opportunities for 18 to 30-year-olds.

The third of the Rotary partners, Rotary Community Corps, added 144 groups in the last quarter, for a total of 4,389. The addition of a corps in Bolivia brings the number of countries with RCCs to 67. Estimated membership in these self-help community organization is 101,150 worldwide.


