This was a project started by PP Hubert Chan at his expense two years ago. Our club will continue to support this project. As a matter of fact, we are not boring wells. No matter how deep we are boring, there would be no water available due to the dryness of the land. In fact we are making "water cellars" to store water from rain and water catchments from the surrounding area. Water is precious in that part of China. We should save water whenever possible.

Pres. Paul then thanked Pinky for such a interesting talk. He then closed the meeting with a toast to RI coupled with the Rotary Club of Hong Kong Island East.
