- Originally, we should have our first dinner meeting on 29th Jan, but it is last 2nd day before Chinese New Year. Thus, it will be cancelled due to expected low attendance. For this reason, our next luncheon will be held on 5th Feb. However, President Jonathan would be out of town and PE Norman will chair the meeting for him.

SAA Jonah was invited to report the Red Box contribution today. We got HK\$1,400 from various members in this luncheon.

Taking this opportunity, President Jonathan also presented the Multiple Paul Harris Fellow pin to Director William. He then asked members to enjoy lunch before our speaker made her presentation.

At 13:20, President Jonathan invited Rtn. Avis to introduce our guest speaker, Ms Annie Leung to members. Ms Annie Leung shared with us the report of 2013 HK/China Executive Leadership Competencies results and how her Peak Performance Leadership Coaching Modules could help top executives to reach their peak performance.

Ms Annie Leung is the founder and the CEO of a reputable consulting company called CEOmindPower Ltd. Annie is a renowned business professional and over her career life she engaged herself in top positions in well-known corporations like Longman Education HK (belonged to Pearson Group); Warner Bros Consumer Products and Mattel East Asia Limited. Back in early days, she started her career in a big advertising agency named O & M (Ogilvy & Mather), then later moved to Watson's (retail chain) in the senior marketing position. From then, she built up profoundly her business and market knowledge about the FMCG markets which surely equips and provides her a good platform for starting her own consultant business.

Coming from a business world occupying the top positions for many years, Annie knew inside-out the problems facing corporations in business growth and sustainability. Most of the time, it is all about "self & people management", "business innovation" and "strategic execution". Thus, in 2006, she founded CEOmindPower, being the Corporate Doctor, providing services around business consultancy, leadership development and executive coaching.

During the luncheon, Annie shared her self-developed and award-winning model called Peak Performance and mindPower Leadership Model with our members. This model has been verified by Hong Kong University and over 50 MNCs and SMEs in HK have tried it before.

Annie quickly shared with us how one can use the Leadership mindPower to reach Peak Performance. mindPower Leadership model measures one's 9 leadership competencies and how they are being applied at work under an intelligent benchmarking and development system. Annie believes that a Peak Performing Leader should be able

to embrace and balance all 9 mindPowers of 仁 (self & people management), 智 (business innovation), 勇 (strategic execution). These 9 leadership competencies are:

- 1) **Pursuing Excellence**: stretch oneself for exceptional results.
- 2) **Inspiring Passion**: touching others to inspire passion & actions.
- 3) **Building Relationships**: Support & empower others to achieve goals.
- 4) **Innovation Management**: Use creative thinking to generate new initiatives
- 5) **Decision Making**: Collect & analyze relevant data for sound decision.
- 6) **Strategic Planning:** Measure risk vs. gain to set strategic priorities.
- 7) **Team Alignment**: embrace diversity to win-win.
- 8) **Upholding Principle**: strengthen value based culture with benchmark.
- 9) **Driving Change**: drive change for growth with resilience.

According to Annie, everyone has the potential to attain all 9 mindPowers leadership. In her assessment module measuring these 9 mindPowers (measurement comes with 70+ attributes), some people may have scored highly in certain mindPowers leadership and scored relatively low in others. It is suggested that those dominant mindPowers used at work can be further optimized; while the least used mindPowers can be further strengthened. The assessment results reflect one's current situation, which can be affected by factors like (a) corporate culture & core values (b) one's job function (c) one's personal leadership strengths/weaknesses. And surely, one's personal leadership strengths and weaknesses can be affected by one's "work mask" in a business setting too.

This assessment module, if further accompanied by another Enneagram module adopted by Annie, one can find out the "Authentic Self", uncover Peak Performance Motives, Blind Spot and Leadership Abilities & Area for Improvement. It enables one to master the skills to inspire and energize others via People Management Kit, in particular, to align different stakeholder and transform from "I" to "WE".

In the end of her speech, Annie shared with members a tracking report about HK & China Executives Leadership Competencies which shall be announced to media in late February 2014. RCHKIE members had a first-hand view of the report in the luncheon. Annie related that according to Harvard Business School's best seller Authentic Leadership: "only leaders who align their motives and ability and aware of their blind spots can achieve peak performance". However, over the past 10 years' consulting experience, 90% of HK executives have misalignment in motives vs. abilities and did not aware of their blind spots. 2012 tracking results indicated that HK executives tend to be strong executors but are lack of long term vision to inspire passion. While they were strong to get things done, they were weak in connecting with different stakeholders to promote company vision. They were also weak in Pursuing Excellence and Innovation Management implies they rely heavily on the past "success formula" - mostly inward focus, not sensitive to macro trend and how to out-perform competitor strategically.

Tracking results of 2014 observed a similar trend but with moves in some key mindPower leadership in different segments. Annie gave her views on the changes as well as the weaknesses of today's executives and the impacts on Hong Kong society and business environment. Annie ended her speech with her interesting observation among males and females executives. Since the findings will not be released till late February, this Bulletin will not highlight the findings.

After Ms Leung's presentation, Pres. Jonathan invited PP Norman to officially thank our Guest Speaker. PP Norman found that the findings were very enlightening and he further stressed that alignment is also very important in Rotary world. Thus, we strongly emphasized on membership's fellowship. He also invited members to bring more quality friends to the Club in order to strengthen our membership base. Pres. Jonathan then presented a souvenir photo to our speaker. He announced that speaker for next luncheon would be announced soon.

The meeting was adjourned after Pres. Jonathan made a toast to Rotary International coupled with the Rotary Club of Hong Kong Island East. The guests and members stayed for a group photo. The meeting ended at 2:10 pm.
