PP Eddy Wong then began to introduce his topic of training on Five Avenue of Services. For years, Rotary's commitment to Service Above Self has been channeled through the Avenues of Service, which form the foundation of club activity.

- **Club Service** focuses on strengthening fellowship and ensuring the effective functioning of the club. Learn about effective club service in <u>Membership</u> and <u>Training</u>.
- **Vocational Service** encourages Rotarians to serve others through their vocations and to practice high ethical standards. Observed each October, <u>Vocational Service Month</u> spotlights Rotary club projects related to this avenue, offering opportunity for clubs and districts to use their professional skills in service projects.
- Community Service covers the projects and activities the club undertakes to improve life in its community.
- **International Service** encompasses actions taken to expand Rotary's humanitarian reach around the globe and to promote world understanding and peace. Rotarians can support International Service by sponsoring a project in another country, seeking international project partners to support projects in their own communities, or by personally volunteering at an international project site.
- **New Generations Service** recognizes the positive change implemented by youth and young adults through leadership development activities as <u>RYLA</u> (<u>Rotary Youth Leadership Awards</u>), <u>Rotaract</u> and Interact, service projects, and creating international understanding with Rotary Youth Exchange.

Then there came the highlight of the day when IT Chair Anthony introduced our speaker of the day being Mr. Terry Tsang and his topic was "Mobile Apps Development in the Coming Future".

Mr. Terry Tsang graduated from HKUST in civil engineering in 2004 and acquired a degree of Master of Philosophy in 2006 is currently a HKUST MBA candidate, Class of 2013.

He set up his IT start-up company, Pencake Limited in 2008, focused on Facebook Apps Development and Mobile Apps Development. These Facebook applications have more than 20 million monthly active users. He is also experienced in managing global marketing campaigns and managing the translation team of 250 translators who are working on over 22 languages. The talk was summarized as follows:

The Talk mainly involved the Mobile Apps Development in both iOS and Android in the last 2 years and it also highlight the potential opportunities in the Mobile Apps for coming future.

- Number of Apps of Apple: 465,729 in Aug 2012
- Number of Apps of Android: 289,305 in Aug 2011
- Forecast by Aug 2012, both Apps of Apple & Android will reach 680,000
- Total Apps download of Apple 18.2B in Aug 2011
- Total Apps download of Android 6.76B in Aug 2011
- Forecast total Apps download by May 2013, both Apple & Android will reach 84.0B
- Different version of Andriod:
 - -2.x for Mobiles mainly
 - -3.x for Tablets mainly
 - 4.x for both Mobiles and Tablets
- Android 2.1 vs 2.2:
 - -Faster
 - -A lot of bugs fix, new API, new modified
 - -C2DM
 - -Native gallery application.
- A research which was conducted in Aug 2011 shown that Weather and business apps generate highest average paid download revenue by category in Android market
- The best selling Android Weather App is Weather Pro \$25
- The best selling Android Business App is Documents to go \$117

Rtn. Francis Li's Report of his visit to Osaka representing the Club in November 2011

I had the honour of representing our Club in attending the District 2660 Conference in Osaka on 12 November 2011.

The Conference was preceded by a reception the day before in honour of Mr. Yasuharu Nakamura, the representative of RI President, at Miyako Hotel, the home base of our sister club, the Rotary Club of Osaka Jonan, for their weekly meeting on Fridays. The reception was well attended not only by representatives of District 2660, but also the many guests invited for the occasion. It was great fellowship. It was also a great feast with good wine that guaranteed a good night of sleep in preparation for the proceedings set for the next day.

The Conference itself took place at the NHK Osaka Hall, whose low –key appearance belies its state-of- the-art internal settings and facilities, not to mention the magnificent view that it enjoys over Osaka Castle which is just a stone throw away.

The main hall for the Conference was packed to its full capacity of about 1,500 seats. The main theme of the Conference, as you may have guessed, was the 311 earthquake and tsunami. Eight months on, a sense of devastation was still felt, but so was Rotary spirit that was evident and eminently brought out by the reports of the delegates on the hard work and assistance of our fellow Rotarians in tackling the aftermath.

Perhaps, the highlight of the Conference was the opening speech of Mr. Toru Hashimoto, the governor of Osaka, as he then was (he has since been elected the mayor of Osaka). Mr. Hashimoto is the youngest governor ever to take the post at the age of 39. He is, however, more well-known for his flamboyant style and his father being a known Japanese mafia. He is often quoted as saying that there is no other city as vulgar and obscene as Osaka. To everyone's relief, his speech was, so I was told by members of our sister club, much restrained than usual and was pleasantly apt for the occasion.

The Conference ended with a marvelous performance of native dance by the delegates of a Sri Lanka Rotary Club.

It was a wonderful two-day event that was, with the usual Japanese attention to details and hospitality, well organized and enjoyable. I was particularly delighted to meet with many old friends of our sister club, including D.G. Taikan Okabe, a great Rotarian and a good friend of mine for more than 18 years.

I took the opportunity of doing a make-up at the Rotary Club of Nara, one of the biggest clubs in Kansai with more than 100 members. I shall bring along their club banner to our next meeting.

The 7th Lunch Party with Elderly Singletons held in the eve of Lunar New Year of Dragon Young Generation shown care and smile

In the noon on Jan 20, 2012, three days before the Lunar New Year of Dragon, President Eric led a team of eight including his wife Christine, PIC MC William Wong, Rtn. Jonah and Rotaractor VP Lisa Chow, Myra Shen, Menty Yu, Emily Zhao participated in the 7th Lunch Party luncheon with 30 elderly singletons in Nan Shan Estate. We gathered at 11 am and received briefing and training before starting the service.

Yum Cha with Dim Sum might not seem like a big deal for most of us. However, for 30 no income elderly singletons who need food bank to provide hot food everyday, Yum Cha might seem like a big deal for them. Thus, the lunch party was conducted in a Chinese restaurant just opposite to the Kindness Center in Nam Shan Estate in this service.

We started a game for 3 tables of elderlies, each table was cared by Rotarians and Rotarators. The game was to state the Greeting for good lucks in the Lunar New Year, one table by one table to each other. The Elderly worked very hard to name the greeting. During the game, full of laughter was burst out.

Then we served with many dishes of hot Chinese food including congees, fried rice, dim sum and Lunar New Year Chinese food. Volunteers served the food to the elderly too. Membership Chair William prepared a photo with photo frame of which he took photo with each elderly in the previous activities. The elderly friends were so excited to receive this gift which reflects our MC William who has devoted to serve them with hearts. Well Done MC William!

We also prepared gift to elderly including some Chinese New Year food and fruits to show care and bring warmth to them. The party ended at 1 pm.

On 20th Jan, three days before the Chinese Lunar New Year, 30 elderly singletons were gathered at the ST. JAMES' SETTLEMANT KINDNESS CENTER waiting for the four Rotaractors of HKIE and four Rotarians to hold a warm lunch party for them.

Yum cha and chatting might be one of the most common things in our daily life. However, it could be the most treasure moment for those 30 elderly singletons. We could easily tell the excitement when they were playing games, the happiness when they were receiving the little gifts and the satisfaction when we were having meal with them. Some of them smiled to you, some of them would like to tell specific of themselves to you, some of them would like to sit quietly beside you or even cried secretly to themselves. They looked like the children who had been through a life of hardness and longed for someone to listen and caring for them. I tried to capture every detail of this picture and felt the love and sensation at this moment. Each lovely smile or simple words could be meaningful to all of them. From that moment, it suddenly occurred to me that caring for somebody does not require too much from us, sometimes just the understanding and company can bring them warmth and happiness. Let's reach out of our hands and help each other to make this world a better place.
