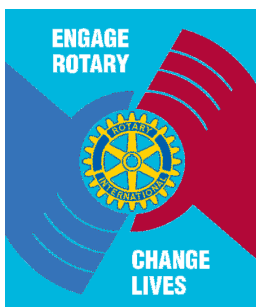

District Governor Nominee Designate (DGND) Eric and IPP Nancy introduced IPP Ronald Hung of Rotaract Club of Lingnan University Students' Union. IPP Ronald, president of Lingnan RAC 2012/2013, is now a 3rd year BBA student majoring in Marketing. During his presidency, IPP Ronald was instrumental in promoting his club, recruiting new members and organizing the first-ever peace service and culture exchange trip to Nepal.

IPP Ronald organized his talk in 3 areas

- Service: South Asians make up about six percent of Hong Kong population and yet they are often overlooked. During his service year, IPP Ronald organized local events/projects specially catering to the teenagers from South Asia. He also led a delegate of club members on a trip to Nepal to better understand the Nepal people and their culture.
- Fellowship: Being able to interact with other Rotaract clubs is an important objective of the Club. IPP Ronald and his members participated in many programs and activities that promoted cross Rotaract club fellowship. That included the Joint University installation, Joint U signing competition and the Annual Dinner and many more.
- Mother Club: IPP Ronald and his members actively participated in RCHKIE activities to show support. Activities included the 10K run, board meetings, vocation talks, etc. During the service year, Lingnan RAC participated in more than 20 different projects. Over 150 members and students participated in and benefits from these events.

Before concluding his report, IPP Ronald gave special thanks to PE Herman, IPP Nancy and DGND Eric for their untiring support.

Next, PP Uncle John gave a brief introduction of Rtn Raymond Chu, RCHKIE newest member, who then came to the podium to share with our members his live stories and background.

Rtn Raymond Chu, a cardiologist for over 25 years, is married and a proud father of 3 children. His eldest son is a doctor, his eldest daughter is an estate manager and his youngest daughter is studying toward her Master degree in Architecture. Brownie, a black Labrador, is Rtn Raymond's latest family addition. Raymond enjoys travelling, fishing, reading and mahjong.

Raymond leads a busy life contributing to the well-being of our society. Raymond is a hospital governing committee member of 3 hospitals, medical consultant of the Methodist center and the founder/Chairman of A.J.R. Charitable Foundation.

A.J.R., a non-profit making and non-government aided charitable organization, has the following missions

- To assist and contribute towards medical research, services and facilities.
- To assist the poor and needy by reason of aging and ill health to supply them with medicine, surgery and medical equipment.
- To help victims of fire, floods, famine, typhoon or other disasters etc.

A.J.R. has a simple organization structure, namely its Chairman, 2 directors, a honorary accountant and 2 volunteers. The source of fund is mainly from the Chairman and the directors. As everyone is a volunteer, there is no administrative cost involved in running the Foundation. Rtn Raymond and the directors are personally involved in screening all projects.

Due to its simple organization, the Foundation has been very effective and efficient when evaluating and approving projects. It typically takes less than 7 days to review and make a decision on project sponsorship. The Foundation has completed over 470 projects since it was established in 1998.

Rtn Tony thanked Rtn Raymond for sharing his live stories and the wonderful projects the A.J.R. Charitable Foundation is doing for the elderly in our community.

PE Norman reminded us that our next meeting will be a dinner meeting and Mr. Ronald Wong will be talking about the Heep Hong Organization.

It was almost 2:00pm when PE Norman adjourned the meeting with a toast to R.I. coupled with RC of St. Ives, RC of Kyoto East and RC of HK Island East.
