What Happened Last Week

This meeting was held on a very cold day, but the warmth of fellowship with the many visitors and guests provided a very good balance. President Desmond opened the meeting by extending a very special welcome to the many ladies present as well as to IPDG Anthony Hung.

It was good to see our long-missing member Henry Luy back into the fold, especially since he was the only birthday boy for the week. PP Hubert was responsible for leading the singing and wishing Henry a very happy birthday.

Several announcements were then made:

IPDG Anthony spoke about the Presidential Conference to be held in Hong Kong from 25 to 27 February, 2000. He advised

that the large contingent of Rotarians who were planning to come from Taiwan, could no longer make the trip (??) and their absence will make it imperative that Hong Kong Rotarians fill these spaces. He urged members to seriously consider coming to the Conference and participating in the discussions about Rotary's future in China and Asia.

VP Stephen reminded members about the forthcoming trip to our sister club in Japan and asked members to let him know as soon as possible if they intended to accompany the Club delegation.

Rtn Kishu advised members that a new blue book has been provided for the registration of visitors to the Club and this should be used in future.

President Desmond reminded members that the next Directors' meeting has been rescheduled to 24 February due to the Chinese New Year break.

Finally, Sergeant Danny reported that there were 24 members present for the meeting and \$1,900 had been donated.

A very important event for this meeting was the induction of our newest member, Rtn Peter Kuang, sponsored by Rtn Bill Lamport. President Desmond was very nervous about performing this duty, likening it to "getting married." Bill first gave some background about Peter: He was born in Hong Kong and, after leaving school, went to Canada for his university education, leading to an MBA. He returned to Hong Kong in 1996 and is married to wife Ingrid. He is apparently a better than average tennis player and has decided his Rotary name will be Pete, apparently in reverence to one of the current greats, Pete Sampras. Pete's classification is Financial Services. Welcome to the Club, Pete.

The last item on the program was the speaker. Rtn Malcolm introduced Mr Hans Goetti, Senior Portfolio Manager, SSB Citi Asset Management Group of Citibank. His topic was "The Global Market Outlook for 2000."

He initially gave a very honest assessment of his successes and failures in forecasting the share markets for 1999. He said that he had correctly predicted the outcomes for Singapore and Japan, but not the Hang Seng and Euro markets due to unpredictable local events that occurred.

He said that the chief driving force for the share markets is abundant liquidity. The bull markets of late 1999 were the result of excessive liquidity, but some Central Banks may now begin to rein this in. He thinks, however, that the exceptions will be Europe and Japan; and maybe the USA. But for the latter, the generation of the post-war baby boom are preparing for retirement in the next 5 to 8 years, and this should provide some

counteracting stimulus. Essentially, Hans believes a bull market should prevail for the next 2 to 3 years.

He observed that, at present, investments are heavily into technology stocks, but that in his opinion, this would decline over 2000 as the market broadens out over other stocks with sound fundamentals.

So, where should money be directed over this year? He gave a quick assessment of the various major markets:

USA: GDP will be up 3-4%

Corporate earnings will rise by 10-12%

Interest rates will rise

Inflationary pressures on commodity prices

Deflationary pressures from global excess and the internet

* He predicts Dow Jones Industrials will go to 12,500; and NASDAQ to 4,888-5,000.

Europe: GDP will be up 3.5%

Corporate earnings will rise by 15-20%

ECB: 50-70 DIPs

New mergers and acquisitions

Restructuring of corporations

A new equity culture

Euro with little downside risk

But politicians could be a wildcard

* He predicts that stock prices should rise in line with corporate earnings.

Japan: There will be constitutional changes

An election in 2000 (therefore, no action to dampen economic growth)

Zero interest rate

High liquidity

Cross shareholdings will unwind

Corporate restructuring

The yen will weaken until mid-year

* He predicts an index target of 22,000 and Nikkei of 225

<u>Asia</u>: There will be strong economic growth


