What Happened Last Week

President Stephen opened the meeting giving a special welcome to visiting Rotarians PP David Stephen from RC of Dingwall, Scotland(close to Lochness). David jumped up with a banner to exchange and explained that he was on a round the world trip. President Stephen gave a special welcome back to Lewis, Andrew Shek and PP Andrew Chen. He then went on to make the following announcements:

- District Conference starting on the 16th with 12 of our members signed up to attend.
- The Golf tournament in Macau will be at the Westin Country Club.
- The next Board meeting will be held on the 14th March, 6-30pm at CCC.
- Kawasaki south had postponed their visit to Hong Kong until the 12th of June.

Sgt. Lawrence announced that \$1,000 had been collected for the Red Box. Rtn. Kishu came forward to the rostrum to introduce the speaker, Kelvin Pang Deputy Commissioner of Correctional Services Department and JP. His topics are Revisitism and Rehabilitation. He first gave a very useful overview of the department:

- 170 inmates per 1,000 population
- 7,000 staff
- 12,000 inmates (rising)
- · 24 institutions and 4 half way houses
- 62% local Hong Kong
- 28% mainland
- 10% other nationals
- 4:1 Male to Female ratio
- 21,000 intake last year
- 48% readmitted within 3 years of release

This means that half the job is rehabilitation, trying to develop socially acceptable behaviour, training, counseling, vocational training and education. The biggest problem the

Cultural activities like arts and crafts become key in using time constructively. A focus must be given to after care support for released inmates and developing community support for a rehabilitation rogramme. Kelvin went on to say that Hong Kong prisons generally meet international standards. Questions were asked about the new super prison and difficulties of cultural integration of other nationals. Rtn. Rudy formally thanked the speaker and praised their services to the community. President Stephen then closed the meeting with a toast to the RC of Dingwall Scotland.

Bhichai Rattakul R.I. President Elect 2002-2003

R.I. President Elect Rattakul was educated in Bangkok and Hong Kong and received an Honorary Doctorate Degree in Political Science from the University of Ramkhamhaeng in Bangkok and Kensington University in California

A member of Parliament since 1969 and for nine terms, he has served his country as Leader of the Democratic Party, Forign Minister and Deputy Prime Minister. Rtn. Rattakul also served as Speaker of the House of Representatives and President of the National Assembly. Before his retirement from politics in September 2000, he also served as President of ASEAN Inter-Parliamentary Union. Bhichai Rattakul has served as Vice-President of the Bangkok YMCA, Director of the Thai chamber of Commerce, the Board of Trade, the Federation of Thai Industries, Vice-President of the International Chamber of Commerce and Leader of Thai Employees Delegation to the International Labour Organization for three consecutive years. He has also led many Thai delegations to the United Nations.

He has been decorated with the Highest honour from the King of Thailand, the Emperor of Japan and the Presidents of the Philippines, Korea, Austria and Nicaragua. Bhichai Rattakul joined the Rotary Club of Dhonburi in Bangkok as a Charter Member in 1958 and has served Rotary International as District Governor, International Assembly Group Discussion Leader, Committee Member and Chairman, Trustee of the Rotary Foundation, Director and Chairman of the Executive Committee of Rotary International. He is the

recipient of The Rotary Foundation's Distinguished Service Award and Citation for Meritorious Service for his support of its International Humanitarian and Educational Programme. He is currently Chairman of the Diplomatic Relations Task Forcer. Bhichai Rattakul is married to Khunying Charoye. They have three children and five grandchildren.


The bartender approaches and tells him, "You know, a pint goes flat after I draw it; it would taste better if you bought one at a time."
