Rotary Service Partner UNICEF Lost its Chairman

Dr. Robert Fung Hing Piu, a Past President of the Rotary Club of Hong Kong and chairman of UNICEF passed away at the age of 74, on 6th March 2009 is survived by his wife and five children. He was a veteran paediatrician who devoted a lifetime to helping the needy children worldwide.

Dr. Robert Fung received his bachelor of arts from Harvard in 1956, followed in 1960 by a doctor of medicine and master of surgery from McGill University in Montreal.

For more than 40 years thereafter he remained a specialist in child medicine, becoming the founding paediatrician-in-chief of the Adventist Hospital. In 1986, He founded the Hong Kong Committee for UNICEF, the United Nations agency to promote children's rights. He worked hard to organize fund raising and advocacy program mes that made significant contributions to UNICEF projects.

We all missed him sorely and wish him rest in peace.
