

SAA William Leung reported that the redbox collection of the day was HK\$1300. PP Eddy gave us Rotary 123 session on vocational service.

Last month marked the fifth time a Hong Kong team had joined the annual Rotary NID (National Immunization Days) trip which took place on February 17-20, 2012. President Eric, PP Norman and Isa joined a group of 32 Rotarians and guests to attend this Rotary NID end polio campaign and reported herein for their life changing experience.

Rotarianne Isa made her debut by giving us a video introduction on their 3-day trip in New Delhi, then recounted on her youth impression how PDG Uncle Peter passionately talked about the Rotary movement to end polio epidemic in the world (among the co-operation of WHO, Rotary and UNICEF).

They went to the poorer areas of New Delhi and working with Rotarians from India (District 3012) to get an opportunity to be hands on and see how the End Polio campaign was making a difference. They came across children from all walks of life who really touched their hearts to know that they were changing a life by providing two simple drops of a vaccine. Their itinerary was as follows:

A Gratifying NID Trip in India

It was almost 25 years ago that I first heard of the project PolioPlus from my dad, PDG Uncle Peter. He told me the aim of this project was to sweep polio from all countries of the world, in which back then polio was just more than common in numerous countries. The ignorant me was thinking it was a mission far from possibility.

During the CNY break, I was with my kids in the Hong Kong Museum of Medical Sciences looking at two charts about the spread of polio, one dated in the mid 80's and the other one dated currently. To my great surprise and amazement, there are now just a few red tiny dots in the world map representing areas still affected by polio today, indeed a vast contrast with what we had some 20 years ago – a globe almost fully painted in red. Immediately, I had such a deep yearning to participate in this year NID to witness the work of PolioPlus.

President Eric, my husband PP Norman and myself set out to India on Friday, 17th February with over 30 plus Rotarians, Rotariannes and friends from various clubs. DG David led the team with high spirit. The first day was a visit to St. Stephen's Hospital where Dr. Matthew Varghese presented to us many successful cases of paralyzed polio children being able to stand up or even walk after appropriate treatments were given. Such an operation cost about US\$400 each, and patients can get free treatment from St. Stephen's Hospital. Yet, out there on the streets are still many children suffering from polio who do not come seek help for just one simple reason – their parents cannot afford to leave their work behind and losing their daily wages, so they have no better choice than to crawl or squat for all their lives throughout. What a heart-breaking information! So prevention is of utmost importance.

The second day, four in a group was sent to different booths to give vaccine to kids under five. We were filled with enthusiasm and fervor. Just in New Delhi there were over 180,000 booths managed by locals and Rotarians from all over the world, and more than 750,000 booths for all over India. The spirit seemed to have linked up each of us with a burning heart, despite of the low temperature in the morning, heated afternoons, polluted air, getting lost on the road... the hurdles we faced were nothing when we partook in this meaningful work.

The third day was even more significant. We went to the slump areas to out reach those with lesser education, those not being able to understand the value of taking polio vaccine. We were well accepted by them and the feeling was gratifying.

I encourage all of you to join the NID next year to better experience for yourselves our profound sentiment.

The service area of Team one was in Kowloon side in Wong Tai Sin and Shumshuipo. The team two served in Shaukeiwan and Chaiwan in HK Island. Both teams finished the service at 12.00 moon, all members and Rotaractors enjoyed the service very much, they said they would definitely participate next time again when time is available.




