

# Last week's Proceedings -

# 8th April, 2009

Pres. Andy started the meeting at 1:02 pm by welcoming all attending members. Pres. Andy welcomed back Rtn. Peter Yeung who had missed several meetings and PP Paul Chan who had been busy and excused from our regular meetings lately. There was no visiting guest today.

We celebrated the birthday for PP Tajwar Shadikhan, with the birthday song led by PP Uncle John Kwok and a birthday gift presented by Pres. Andy.

Pres. Andy then reported the followings:

District Assembly will be held on April 18t, 2009 at the Hong Kong Jockey Club, Shatin Club House. Pres. Andy reminded all officers and directors for the coming year to attend.

Pres. Andy will lead the delegates from RC of HKIE to visit Osaka Jonan on May 28th, 2009 to celebrate their 40th Anniversary. Those who wish to join this trip please contact Pres. Andy ASAP to reserve your seat.

On April 2nd, our members together with 5 members from RC of Osaka Jonan have visited the Play Scope of Play Right in Tai Woo Estate. The new premise was designed by the Japanese. There we have attended the Donation Ceremony of Playful Booklet for the Hospitalized Children which was a joint project of RC HKIE and Osaka Jonan. We had a good time and enjoyed the fellowship with our Japanese partners.

On April 3rd, we have celebrated our 55th Anniversary dinner at the World Trade Centre Club in Causeway Bay. There were over 110 participants for the party. We have all enjoyed the program and our guests had a very good time.

Acting SAA PDG Uncle Peter reported the red box collection of HK\$1,700. PP Tajwar had contributed handsomely HK\$500 to celebrate his own birthday.

Hon. Sec. Heman introduced the speaker of today. He is none other than our own PP Tim Lui. Hon. Sec. has spent more than 5 minutes just to update us on the latest honorary titles of PP Tim Lui.

PP Tim wanted to share his valuable experiences in the National People's Congress. PP Tim requested the permission from PP Tajwar for using Cantonese for his talk as it involved a lot of terminologies in China, it would be beneficial to all audiences. PP Tajwar granted the permission as he was the only non-Chinese member attending this meeting.

PP Tim shared with us some interesting stories during his time in the National People's Congress (NPC) meeting in Beijing. This was the second part of the 11th meeting. There are over 3,000 NPC representatives, but only 2,985 real qualified members. Some members are temporary disqualified due to misconduct. There are also some Taiwanese who have been residing in China elected as NPC representatives. The most important obligation as NPC representative is to attend this annual conference and vote. Hong Kong has now 36 elected NPC representatives, but the figure is low compared to other provinces.

One of the changes made recently was that all the NPC representatives would sing the National Hymn together before the meeting start. The old practice was just to play the National Hymn recording.

This year, the Hong Kong representatives have submitted 100 proposals among 36 members. PP Tim has made 6 proposals himself.

The representatives nowadays really involve in the discussion and wisely select their vote. The People's Republic of China is moving towards democracy in its own pace. There were more opposing votes in many proposals nowadays as compared to a few years ago with almost 100% supporting votes.

The NPC representatives are no longer dummies, they are really representing their respective provinces and profession to help the country towards modernization.

PP Hubert thanked PP Tim and also shared his experience as a representative of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference.

Our luncheon meeting adjoined at 2:10 pm. Pres. Andy Wong then proposed a toast to RI, coupled with the Rotary Club of Hong Kong Island East. All members were invited for a group photo.

## **Rotary Potpourri**

#### The RI Board Decision

(1) At the third meeting of the RI board held in January 2009, it has considered many redistricting proposals, ultimately approving four new districts and the consolidation of three districts into two. The board advised several districts to meet the minimum size of 30 clubs and 1,000 Rotarians by 31st December 2010, or the board will take action to consolidate. To help in the effort, the board requested the president to appoint regional advisory committees to work with clubs and districts on long-term districting and membership strategies.

In addressing membership issues, the board adopted a set of guiding principles to support the association's longterm membership strategy. As a component of these principles and to convey this idea that membership is the responsibility of each Rotarian, the board agreed to the use of a new membership slogan

pending legal review by the general secretary.

(2) The board took a number of steps to reduce cost of the association, ultimately resulting in a positive 2008-2009 budget variance of US\$107,200.

(3) The board agreed to provide travel insurance for all Rotarians and their spouses when traveling at the president's request on Rotary funded business, RI programmes, communications and awards.

(4) The board noted that RI has received cash and commitments of US\$73 million towards the total challenge of raising US\$200 million to match US\$355 million in challenge grants received from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.

(5) To increase a wareness of Rotaract, Interact, RYLA and Youth Exchange, the board encouraged governorselect to consider including information on these programmes at their PETS, and also encouraged district RYLA committee chairs to invite governors and governors-elect to RYLA events to help bring greater awareness to RYLA programme.

(6) The board took step to enhance youth protection at district-organized events by revising the approval process for multidistrict Interact meetings, by also agreeing that clubs and districts should require parents to provide travel insurance for their children when traveling outside their local community, and by establishing new youth protection policies and procedures that clubs and districts must develop, maintain, and comply with when traveling with youth.
