- PP John advised that those members going to the District Conference in Macau should give Uncle Peter their ID card numbers which will facilitate a quick passage through Immigration in Macau, as well as include them in a VIP welcome and transportation to the Conference venue.
- President Desmond reported some very good news for the
 Club: Four District awards for 1999-2000. These were
 for:
 - 1. International Service
 - 2. Weekly Club Bulletin (English)
 - 3. Joint Hosting Membership Seminar
 - 4. Club History (recorded on CD)

These awards will be presented at the forthcoming District Conference in Macau.

President Desmond also announced that the DG's monthly newsletter was available and that the Club Racing Night went off very well. He thanked Rtns Robert and Kenny for their efforts in organizing this event.

Sergeant Stephen then reported that there was a very good attendance with 26 members present and \$1,400 had been donated.

It was fortunate that Rtn Jason was present at this meeting as President Desmond had remembered to bring a birthday present for him. Happy birthday, Jason!

The final event was the talk given by PP Rob titled, "Thinking Skills: Your Optimum Resource in a Competitive World."

PP Rob said that over the past 10 years, the economy of Hong Kong had progressed from one based on manufacturing to knowledge and services in an electronic environment. Electronic commerce has been responsible for intensifying competition because competitors are no longer confined to firms in Hong Kong - competition is now global.

This should not be daunting if companies realize that an information based economy requires firms to generate new knowledge rapidly to stay ahead of their rivals. The firms which will survive and prosper in this new environment are those which have staff who can think well. Creative and critical thinking should therefore be regarded as a resource by all firms and, like any other resource, it requires investment. Rob's company, *IntelX* Ltd is engaged in training people in the skills of creative and critical thinking.

Rob then explained that creative thinking is a cognitive ability that can be substantially learned. He showed a diagram which illustrated that the skill is to use techniques to disrupt the normal linear thinking patterns, and when stability is regained, it is likely that a unique solution or idea has been arrived at. This process is, in fact, the basis of all humour and jokes.

He then pointed out that there were distinct applications for creative thinking in the corporate area. These include:

- 1. Developing new products
- 2. Enhancing old products (Here he gave a demonstration using fruit juice containers.)
- 3. Improving company structures, policies and culture
- 4. Enhancing marketing, advertising, cost-cutting, recruiting, diversification, etc.

To give members an idea of how training in creative thinking proceeds. PP Rob took them through one technique called the Concept Challenge. This involves taking a policy, process, product, or procedure and isolating concepts associated with it - then challenging these concepts. He illustrated this process with several examples for drying washing.

Members were then given the task in groups of copying this procedure in developing creative ideas for mobile telephones. Nobody suspected that there was so much latent creativity bottled up in this Club! And PP Hubert could be seen busily copying down enough ideas to keep his company busy for years to come.

Time was up, and PE Tajwar thanked PP Rob for his presentation.

To close the meeting, President Desmond proposed a toast to the Rotary Club of Hiroshima South.


Rotary Information

A Rotary version of Olympics staged in the Philippines

The 20th edition of the Rotarympics, a version of the Olympics initiated by Filipino Rotarians for the disabled, was concluded recently in Quezon City, the Philippines.

A derivative of the words Rotary and Olympics, the Rotarympics was started by the Rotary Club of Diliman, Quezon City, in 1981 to observe the International Year for Disabled Persons. Since then, the event has been staged annually by the club. Instantly successful, the Rotarympics now serves as the venue for the selection of national athletes to represent the Philippines in international games for the disabled.

This year's Rotarympics began on February 13, at the UP Village Barangay Centre, Quezon City, with basketball on wheels, lawn tennis and table tennis competitions. The second portion was held on February 20 at the ULTRA in Pasig with track and field, swimming, volleyball, slalom on wheels and an exhibition match in judo. It attracted many spectators.

An elderly man lay dying in his bed. In death's agony, he suddenly smelled the aroma of his favourite chocolate chip cookies wafting up from downstairs.




