- 4. An Extraordinary General Meeting (EGM) of the Rotary Club of Hong Kong Island East is to be held on 11 June, 2014 Weds at 1:00pm, Regal Hong Kong Hotel, at our regular luncheon meeting, for consideration, and if deemed fit, to pass the following resolutions:
 - a) To adopt the amended Bylaws (passed pursuant to Article 33(e) of the Articles of Association of the Rotary Club of Hong Kong Island East Limited).
 - b) To adopt the change of meeting schedule starting from July 2014 onward as follows: Every Wed. 12:30pm to 2:00pm except the first Wed. of each month, 7:00pm to 9:00pm. Please kindly attend this important Extraordinary General Meeting and cast your vote.
- 5. The Rotary Leadership Institute (RLI) is a multi-district, grass root leadership development program of member districts organized into regional divisions in various parts of the world. RLI seeks to have Rotary Clubs in its member districts identify those Rotarians who appear to have the potential for future club leadership (not necessarily as club presidents) and provide those so identified with a quality education in Rotary knowledge and leadership skills so important in voluntary organizations. Rotary Leadership Institute Part 2 will be moved from May 17 2014 (Sat) to June 7, 2014(Sat). Venue will be at Rosedale in the Park, Causeway Bay.
- 6. Next week 28th May Wed will be our 4th REGULAR dinner meeting. New members Mr. Johnny Cheng and Mr. Chris Kyme will be inducted during this meeting.

After his announcements, President Jonathan invited Acting Sergeant-At-Arm (SAA) William Wong to report the Red Box contributions from members today. We got HK\$1,700 generous supports from attending members and guests. Before the speaker made the presentation, Pres. Jonathan let all members enjoyed our luncheon first.

At 1:30 pm, Pres. Jonathan invited Chief District Secretary (CDS) Eric Chin to introduce our Guest Speaker today. Ms Callie Czerkie is a Regional Grants Officer of The Rotary Foundation who looks after the grant matters. She has been with Rotary for 4 years initially supporting matching and district simplified grants and now global and district grants. Callie currently works with grants in Taiwan and previously worked with grants in Hong Kong. She was in Taiwan last weekend supporting Zone Team Training Seminar.

Ms Callie Czerkie took over the podium and started to make a brief introduction of the New Global Grant System to all of us.

First of all, she explained the goals of the New Grant Model as follows:

- Simplify Foundation programs and processes
- Focus Rotarian service efforts where they will have the greatest impact by addressing priority world needs that are relevant to Rotarians
- Offer program options to help achieve both global and local goals
- Transfer Rotary Foundation decision making to the district level
- Increase understanding of The Rotary Foundation's work by Rotarians and enhance Rotary's public image

And then she introduced what the Global Grants are:

- Global grants fund long-term projects and activities that are sustainable, measurable and address goals within one or more areas of focus.
- Global grants evolved out of the Matching Grant and 3H Grant programs and are intended to have a long-term impact on the benefitting community, well after grant funding has been expended.
- Global grants are matched by the World Fund with cash contributions receiving a 50% match and DDF contributions receiving a 100% match.
- Grant awards range in amounts from US\$15,000-US\$200,000

She also mentioned to us that the types of Global Grant Activities usually fell in the following:

Humanitarian Projects

• Global grants may support humanitarian projects that provide sustainable, measureable outcomes in the benefitting community.

Scholarships

• Global grants may support graduate-level scholars whose field of study and professional goals further one of the six areas of focus.

Vocational Training Teams

• Global grants may support VTT's, groups of professionals traveling abroad to either learn about their profession or teach local professionals about a particular field.

Thus, in order to successfully apply for the Global Grant, all projects should be designed according to the 6 areas of focus raised by RI:

- Peace and Conflict Prevention and Resolution
- Disease Prevention and Treatment
- Water and Sanitation
- Maternal and Child Health
- Basic Education and Literacy
- Economic and Community Development

She also gave project examples of the above focuses for our reference. However, she highlighted that we should fully understand what "Sustainability" is. The Rotary Foundation considers a project to be sustainable if it provides long-term solutions to community needs that the beneficiaries can maintain after grant funding ends. And this is a very good tip for us to design our future project if we want to apply for new global grant from the Rotary Foundation.

After her presentation, CDS Eric supplemented that Callie was the one who processed our matching grant for the Choi Jun School Multi-Media Room project. Her professional way of handling our grant application helped us a lot. President Jonathan presented a Club banner and a memorial photo to the speaker and then invited PP Eddy to give an official vote of thanks to our speaker.

Pres. Jonathan further reminded all members to attend next week's dinner meeting on 28th May. Two new members will also be inducted in next dinner meeting. He also announced that we would have a small auction for the three gifts from our Sister Clubs for our 60th Anniversary.

After proposing a toast to RI coupled with RC of Kowloon West, HK Harbour and HK Island East, he invited all attending Rotarians and Guests to stay for Group Photo.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:00 pm sharp for members to return to work as normal.
