To close the meeting, PE Stephen proposed a toast to the Rotary Club of Kwai Chung.




# Rotary Information

1000 Rotarians. "I congratulate District Governor Mamdouth Badr EI Dine and you Rotarians for the efforts to increase the number of Rotarians in the district. We're making a big difference by creating awareness and taking action," he said.

At the Cairo meeting, President Devlyn made Egypt's First Lady Mrs. Suzanne Mubarak and Gamal Mubarak, her son, honorary Rotarians. "You are an outstanding first lady and everybody is sincerely proud of you and your work," the RI president told Mrs. Mubarak. "We welcome you in the world of Rotary."

Mrs. Mubarak told attendees that voluntary work is closely linked to developing the younger generation's ability to give and encourages them to take responsibility in social, economic, cultural, and humanitarian development activities. "We believe that the future begins with a dream and that the young are our dream of the future and our tool to achieve comprehensive development in all fields," she said.

On 4-6 May, President Devlyn visited with Rotarians in Israel, where he attended the District 2490 Conference at Eilat. The RI president's next stop was Turkey, where he spent three days meeting with senior Rotary leaders and the country's President Ahmet Necdet Sezer, whom he presented with RI's Award of Honor. When he arrived in Istanbul on' 7 May, President Devlyn was welcomed by District 2420 Governor Hatice Sarizi, Past District Governor Orscelik Balkan, and other Rotary leaders. Later, he met with District 2440 Governor Aydin Isik and Past District Governor Ayhan Ozdemir and attended Rotary club meetings in Izmir and Ankara.

In addition to speaking to Rotarians in Turkey about the importance of service and the work of the RI task forces, President Devlyn visited Rotary projects that included a sock factory employing disabled people, a school for visually impaired children, the reconstruction of the hospital at Kocaeli University, and the Rotary Vocational Training Center at Sakarya University.

## With online magazines, Rotary becoming global village

Seventeen of RI's family of 27 official regional magazines now have a presence on the Internet, bringing Rotarians ever closer to the ideal of a global village united by communication technology.

Published in 20 languages worldwide, these magazines are distributed in 121 countries and have a combined total circulation of 750,000. Their affiliated Web sites feature content in local languages, and many also have a section in English. With the remaining 10 publications poised to go online at some point, and more and more Rotarians gaining access to the Internet, the day is not far off when every corner of the Rotary world will be just a mouse-click away.


