# What Happened Last Week

President Stephen opened the meeting and gave a special welcome to our own member PP Con and Ex Rotarian of our club Robert Lai. PP John Kwok was welcomed back from the USA whilst visiting Rotarian KM Chau from the RC of Kowloon was welcomed.

President Stephen went on to make the following announcements:

That our sister club Kawasaki South had donated 100,000 Yen to our club.

That PP George Leung with the assistance of our International Service Director Laurence, would be leading the forth coming visit to our sister club in Makati.

That the following Rotarians have resigned, WS Lam, PP Dave Chang and Ates Yucel leaving about 40 members to start the next Rotary year. Pres. Stephen hoped that this would be the lowest membership and that things would improve next year.

President Stephen also proposed that the Red Box collection from today's meeting should be donated to the China Flood Relief Programme, this was seconded by Uncle Peter and resolved without objection.

Acting SAA Rudy announced that \$1,400 had been collected and Robert Lai very generously donated \$600 to round the sum to \$2,000.

President Stephen suggested that the club increase the sum to \$5,000 and make it a Community Service project. All the members present supported this.

President Stephen then handed the meeting over to PE Chris to Chair the Club Assembly.

PE Chris got straight down to the proceedings by recapping the main topics of the last assembly and using them as a framework for discussion, namely:

is Raymond Lee with assistance from Clark, and Desmond and Tony as advisors. The incoming board will be calling upon its members to contribute in this regard.

50th ANNIVERSARY- Henry Chan is leading this initiative and will be looking for committee support in the coming year. Henry mentioned that the key event is being organized with a special theme and the date and other details are being settled. The anniversary year will also have a feature charity programme in which PP Hubert as offered to play a central role.

ATTENDANCE TEAMS- PP John Kwok is very keen to continue with teams and is proposing that 4 or 5 teams are set up to promote membership and attendance.

FELLOWSHIP- Rudy suggested that some evening fellowship functions could be arranged that included Rotaryannes. PP David expressed the view that additional functions were difficult for members with children of school age, citing PP Desmond as a classic example. PP George suggested that functions could be arranged to attract member's families, including children to attend.

MEETING VENUE & COST- The latest view on this topic is that the Excelsion location is good, the food quality / cost represents fair value compared with other Rotary Clubs and the function rooms are fine. PP George also pointed out that there were many intangible benefits to the club of staying in the same location. The consensus was that we should continue with the present arrangement whilst at the same time continuously liaise with the hotel to see if more mutually beneficial arrangements could be developed.

ATTENDANCE- PP John Kwok said that attendance "isn't good" and needed to be improved.

SUBSIDEES FOR NEW MEMBERS- this was discussed with views being polarized. The Topic will need a more detailed debate, and this was proposed to be carried forward to the next Club Assembly.

PE Chris asked one last question of the members taken from the RI president's plan, "What makes this a good club to attract new members?" The answer that came back was "we the members, our integrated fellowship and camaraderie"

BROADER BASED MEMBERSHIP- recognizing the social changes in Rotary regarding membership PP Conhumbly opined that we were not yet good enough.

PE Stephen announced that he would be presenting his year end report next week and formally closed the meeting with a toast to RC Kowloon.

# Rotary Information

Presidential Conference in Malaysia - Registration is in progress for the first RI presidential conference of the 2002-03 Rotary year. Based on a theme of peace and development, the 9<sup>th</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> August meeting will be held in Kuala Lumpur, the bustling modern capital city of Malaysia.

This meeting will provide an opportunity to bring Rotarians in Asia and the surrounding countries together to cultivate peace and development throughout the world. We will hear from internationally renowned experts on conflict resolution and take an in-depth look at the mission of our Rotary Centers for International Studies.

The event will feature topics that include successful conflict resolution, aid to victims of violence and displacement, opportunities for volunteer work in Asia and beyond, challenges in combating poverty and improving health education and food production, and the Concentrated Language Encounter (CLE) method of teaching.

2002-03 RI President Bhichai and incoming Rotary Foundation Trustee Chairman Glen Kinross will make keynote addresses outlining the new Rotary theme - "Sow the Seeds of Love" and Foundation programmes for the year. A project fair will bring together Rotary clubs and districts looking to co-sponsor World Community Service projects.

In addition, the conference will offer attendees the opportunity to enjoy Rotarian fellowship and friendship in a Malaysian setting. The country's mixed heritage goes back 10,000 years, making Kuala Lumpur a true Asian melting pot with a diverse population that includes Malays, Chinese, Indians and Orang Asli, as well as Buddhists, Christians, Hindus and Muslims.

Participants venturing outside the conference venue will be able to see beautiful mosques, temples, preserved British colonial buildings and the ultra-modern Petronas towers - the world's tallest buildings. They also can sample Malaysia's rich, spicy and tropical cuisine during a tour of Kuala Lumpur's botanic gardens, the Central Market and many more local attractions.

To secure a place at the conference, Rotarians and guests are invited to register by the 26th July deadline.


