Other significant guests from HK Polytechnic University included Professor Peter YUEN, the Dean of the College of Professional and Continuing Education, and Dr Y L SO, the Deputy Director and Division Head of Hong Kong Community College, and two HKCC faculty advisors: Dr. Pamela Kwok and Dr. Jandia Poon.

Guests from other clubs included DGN Eugene, DGN 2014-15 Belinda, PDG Ada, AG Mitzi, Pres. Estella, Pres. Alex and PP Wendy. A lot of Rotarians from mother club supported the event. Serving Underprivileged Family, 7th Electrical Appliance Delivery Service
Reflection from Rotarian Stacy Ho

On June 2nd 2012, two teams of Rotarians participated in the 7th Electrical Appliance Delivery Service. Many thanks to Rotarian Membership Chair William Wong who is PIC. The participants of the day were Rotarian Jonah, Director Kevin, Rotarian Stacy with her Mother Melo. Volunteer from Hong Kong University Shaliman Cheung.

Team 1 was assigned Kowloon cases, and Team 2 was assigned Hong Kong Island cases. I was part of Team 1, headed by Rotarian Jonah, and thus this write-up is the service report as experienced by Team 1. In total we visited 4 cases, 1 in Hung Hom, and 2 in Sham Shui Po (Shep Kip Mei area). For each case we distributed the respective electrical appliances, and a shopping trolley of love (filled with goodies such as a bag of rice, crackers, oatmeal, sardines and other food).

Of the 4 cases that Team 1 visited the most notable one was the case of the Single-Father in Lam Tin. This single father is 65 years old and has 4 children, aged from 3 to 12. His wife had left him. His apartment was on the 1st floor of a public rental housing estate block, located just about the complex's garbage disposal area. As we entered his home, we noticed that it was relatively spacious, around 700-800 sq.ft. The front door opened into a spacious living room/dining room area, there was one large bedroom to the right, and a large kitchen. Perhaps the "spacious" feeling was heightened by the lack of furniture. The apartment was empty-save for 3 bed frames and one fan. His kitchen had no appliances, no stove, no fridge, no washing machine. Thus, the single father was more than elated to receive a fan. A rice cooker, and the trolley of love.

Regarding the furniture, actually the single-father had recently moved into this apartment with nothing, just himself and his kids. Since he lives above the garbage disposal area (there is a lingering pungent odor), one day he noticed that someone had thrown away 3 bedframes. Thus he took the bedframes home to be used as beds for his children. Bedframe – no mattress. The fan that he took was also from the garbage disposal area and did not work properly. We met his youngest daughter, who was very shyly in the corner drawing in her notebook. This daughter was happy to when we opened the trolley of love, very happy to see crackers.

Rotarian Jonah also presented the single-father with our RCHKIE Club Flag, which is now hanging in their living room – the only decoration. When the single-father hung the flag, there was a feeling that this flag represents hope, the flag acts as a reminder that there are people out there that care for him and his family.

When we departed, we wished this man good luck and happiness. We left with a strong sense that we need to do more for this particular family. Currently we are looking into giving more service to this specific case. Participating in service projects like these provides opportunities to witness first-hand how RCHKIE impacts our communities. In the 7th Electrical Appliance Delivery Service project, we distributed not only appliances, but also and most importantly, we distributed hope and love. We will keep you posted about updates with the Lam Tin Case, we hope to update you with happy news soon!

Following for Lam Tin Case (June 16 completed):

Urgent approval by the sponsor PP Uncle John with the support of President Eric, we used the spare budget to buy by St. James Settlement and delivered to the concerned family: Fortress refrigerator: \$2500 and Fortress washing machine: \$2600

After the delivery of electrical appliances, I strongly feel that need for help from some deprived family. Those family is facing many constraints such as sickness, taking care of babies by single parent. All these make them not available to earn money. This action is thus very meaningful and practical in helping them. At the same time, the action called for awareness on environmental issue.

This Service Project finally came to end (Dec 2011 – June 2012) servicing over 42 Underprivileged Families, over 100 small electrical appliance delivery in 7 Visits on Saturdays, and mobilized over 56 members and their families members coupled with rotaractors and volunteers. Thanks to the sponsorship of HK\$23000 from PP Uncle John.

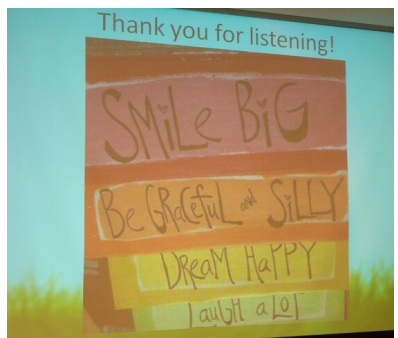

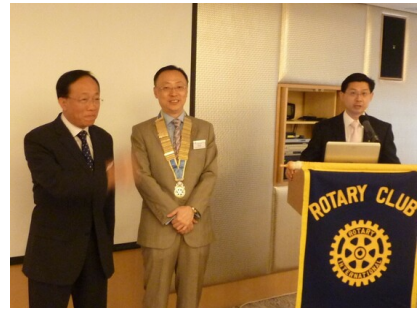

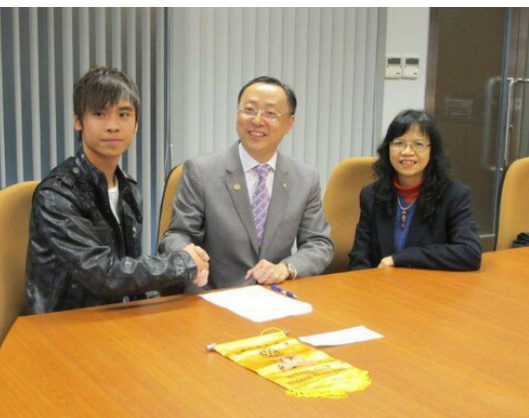

New Rotary Adopt A School Partnering School

On July 7, 2011, we formally launched our application for RAAS with Holy Carpenter Secondary School (HKCC) which is located in the Tai Wan Road, Hunghom. The school is a Band 3 schools catering for mainland migrants students and low income families students. There were +400 students. After sponsoring 1 year of Hip Hop Dance training to their 30 students, We believe we can provide more value to the underprivileged children by becoming their partners in helping their students to build up self image, self confidents, vocation and leadership training.

On April 6, 2012, A formal signing agreement was held in Regal Riverside Hotel witnessed by Education Bureau (Mr Kenneth Chen, JP, Under Secretary for Education). President Eric represented the RC HKIE and Vice Principal Joseph Tse represented the HCSS by signing the agreement as Partner.
