PE Norman then invited Rtn. Teresa to introduce speaker Ms. Mei Ling Ng who talked about "Global Citizenship Education & Peace." This talk is an informative talk about the District Peace Project.

Our speaker Ms. Mei Ling Ng is the founder of Hong Kong Matchmakers and MeilingCircle.com. She speaks 4 languages and holds a Master Degree in English Literature. For more than 16 years, she has been an active member of the American Women's Association, holding various Board positions including Chairman of Education and Scholarship Fund for marginal students in Hong Kong. She is also the founder of the AWA Scholarship in Ling Nan University helping many young women to attain tertiary education, thereby successfully bringing their families out of poverty.

Ms. Ng began by introducing UNESCO, full name as United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, formed on 4 Nov 1946, situated in Place de Fontenoy, Paris, with the headquarter inaugurated on 3 Nov 1958. Currently UNESCO has 195 member states and 9 assocaite members. Interesting to note that China is Full Member, while Hong Kong is a member of the China Federation of UNESCO Clubs and Assos. UNESCO Hong Kong Association Limited is a charitable institution under Section 88 of the Inland Revenue Ordinance.

## The purpose of UNESCO is

- To contribute to peace and security
- By promoting international collaboration through education, science and culture
- in order to further universal respect for ustice, the rule of law and human rights
- along with fundamental freedom proclaimed in the UN Charter.

The 3 major aims of UNESCO are to contribute to:

- The building of peace,
- The eradication of poverty,
- Sustainable development through intercultural dialogue

These aims are achieved through 5 major programs:

- Education
- Natural Sciences
- Social and Human Sciences
- Culture
- Communication and Information

Ms. Ng then talked about the Global Citizenship Education (GCE)

- One of the three priorities of the United Nations Secretary-General Ban Ki Moon's Education First Initiative (GEFI) launched in 2012
- A strategic objective within UNESCO's Education Programme

#### The aims of GCE include:

- To empower learners in engaging <u>active roles both locally and internationally</u> to face and resolve global challenges
- To build a sense of **global community** and **common humanity** (人文) in the world
- To become proactive contributors to a more just, <u>peaceful, tolerant, inclusive, secure and sustainable</u> <u>world</u>

Ms. Ng quoted a few examples on the issues we are facing, which are

- 1. Fraternity is a wonderful thing, and solidarity is all empowering, but excessive Nationalism becomes fanaticism ---- football hooligans fighting in riots with fans of the opposite team, and small child swearing at the fans of the opposite teams
- 2. Patriotism is a noble merit, but excessive patriotism becomes chauvinism ---- the Japanese government, changes text books to justify Diaoyu Island, erase Lorean comfort wives and to negate Nanjing Massacre, etc
- 3. Liberty is fundamental Human Right, but excessive liberty becomes anarchy, and a loss of direction....

#### With Global Citizenship Education, we hope to

- Increasing global interdependence and interconnectedness of people and places
- Collective effort and wisdom at international and local level to embrace global challenges
- Increasing emphasis on values, attitudes and communication skills in education for a globalized world

## And induce the following to our fellow society:

- **Knowledge**: able to recognize global challenges, issues and trends
  - e.g. Sustainable seafood (Environmental), Polio (Disease prevention & child health), Anti-poverty (Economic & community development), Water issues
- Universal values
  - e.g. peace, caring, non-discrimination, tolerance
- Skills
  - Key skills
    - e.g. communication, critical thinking, problem-solving and decision-making, creativity, coping with complexity and uncertainty
      - Soft skills
    - e.g. empathy, listening skills, relationship building and networking

Ms. Ng then shared a few District initiatives in 2013 - 14 including Peacemakers' Celebration on 12 April 2014, Hong Kong Science Park, UN International Day of Peace on 21 Sept 2013 at St. John's Cathedral

She subsequently stated the peace actions that the coming District Peace committee will take which include individual, cultural and political peace, peace with environment and social harmony. The coming District Peace events include:

- 1. UN International Day of Peace on 21 Sept 2014, Sunday
- 2. Peacemakers' Celebration on 18 April 2015, Saturday

# Ms. Ng then urge Rotarians to support

- 1. District Peace Project
  - PEACE, an area of focus since the early day of Rotary.
  - Be a Rotary Peacemaker and promote the culture of peace to our young people and the general public to reach out to over 10,000 people in our District
  - Support this Rotary Peace Movement: 'Light up Rotary & let our light shine in our communities'.
  - Leverage this platform together with you Club service partners, your adopted schools, sponsored Interact and Rotaract Clubs to make the impact.
  - Be part of this peace effort to nurture this annual project to become an Icon for D3450 and UNESCO HK, Rotary's alliance.
- 2. Commission on Youth Funding Scheme
  - Supported by the Commissioner on Youth's Large-scale Youth Programme Funding Scheme on a matching basis.
  - Make a contribution to secure this HKSAR Government Matching Fund capped at HK\$501,000.
  - Your contribution is tax deductible : for every \$100 contributed, the Government will match with \$100.
  - Individual's contribution starting from \$500 will be recognized in name.
