

PE Jonathan made the introduction of our speaker of the day. His Excellency Governor Adrian Davis was an economist by training and a British civil servant, and being the current Governor of Montserrat. Since 1989 he had worked for the Department for International Development (DFID). In his London postings, Mr. Davis was focused on information technology policy and operations and on environment & sustainable development issues including climate change.

Governor Davis had many overseas postings before including the Philippines, where he was the UK Representative to the Asian Development Bank. For a period of seven years he was based in Beijing working on the impact of China on international development issues and overseeing the DFID programme there as well as in Cambodia, Indonesia and Vietnam. In 2010, he was appointed Governor of Montserrat, an island of a British overseas territory located in the West Indies.

Governor Adrian Davis had his topic of “Governing a British Overseas territory - the Case of Montserrat”. Before governing Montserrat, Governor Adrian Davis worked in China, Philippines, Egypt, Thailand and Bangladesh. We put our hands together to welcome Gov. Davis.

Governor Davis then described to us that Montserrat was a British overseas territory located in the Leeward Islands, part of the chain of islands called the Lesser Antilles in the West Indies. Montserrat was nicknamed the Emerald Isle of the Caribbean both for its resemblance to coastal Ireland and for the Irish ancestry of some of its inhabitants.

Caribbean was a land rich of musical talents & cultural heritage. In 1979, The Beatles producer George Martin’s AIR Studios Montserrat opened and the island attracted world-famous musicians who came to record in the peaceful, quiet and lush tropical surroundings of Montserrat.

However, the last decade of the 20th century brought two catastrophic events which devastated the island.

- September 17, 1989 Hurricane Hugo struck Montserrat with full force producing sustained winds of 140 miles per hour and damaging many structures on the island. AIR Studios closed, and the tourist economy upon which the island depended was mostly wiped out.
- Within a few years the island had recovered considerably—only to be struck again by disaster on July 18 1995, the previously dormant Soufrière Hills volcano became active. Eruptions destroyed Montserrat's Georgian era capital city of Plymouth and two-thirds of the island's population was forced to flee. The volcanic activity continues to the present.

The present population was down from 13,000 to about 6,000 people now.

Out of which, about 750 of them were government employees, serving the local community, led by their locally elected Premier.

Since the devastations of Hurricane Hugo and the eruption of the Soufriere Hills Volcano, the Montserratian economy has been effectively halted. Export businesses currently based in Montserrat deal primarily in the selling and shipping of aggregate for construction. Imports include virtually everything available for sale on the island.

The island's operating budget is largely supplied by the British government and administered through the Department for International Development (DFID) amounting to approximately £25 million per year. The city had received an abundance of consultancy studies regarding her future re-development.

Currently, the city was focused in the geo-thermal energy generation, (the volcano side benefits) to make good economic sense of sustainable development. Next they would look into the volcano ashes being a potential source of natural fertilizer.

Hopefully, the island would be popular again for volcano tourism, with working musicians who might return there to record while taking advantage of the island's climate and beautiful surroundings.

There were Q&A to Governor Davis and at end PP Laurence thanked the speaker in our usual Rotary manners. Pres. Nancy led us to make a toast to RI coupled with RC of Montserrat, Wanchai and HK Island East and then adjourned the meeting in time. The visiting Rotarians and guests were invited to stay for a group photo with our members.

 Submit reports for all Rotary Foundation grants and programs on time
 Prepare to apply for 2013-14 Rotary Foundation global and packaged grants

April *NEW* Qualified clubs and districts begin submitting application for
2013-14 Rotary Foundation grants online

June RI Convention workshops

2013-14 Participate
1 July 2013 Begin using new Rotary Foundation grants


