Pres. Nancy then made the following announcements:



Rtn. Dominic Shui then proceeded to introduce our speaker Mr. Andy Ho, JP who shared with us his speech titled "My Days in the Government War Room".

Mr. Andy Ho was appointed as the key public relations adviser for the Chief Executive of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region in June 2006. He had served as Information Coordinator of the Chief Executive's Office for over six years until June 2012, overseeing the public communication strategies of all major government crises and policy issues.


He was the Political Editor of the *South China Morning Post* and Chief Editorialist of *Ming Pao*. He had acted as public affairs consultant for a wide spectrum of corporations and public bodies before he joined the government.

Mr. Ho specializes in the reading and shaping of public opinions. More than 6,000 officials and executives have attended his communication and media skills seminars and workshops.

After stepping down from his position as Information Coordinator of the Chief Executive's Office, he is very busy in delivering his speeches in different occasions

Mr. Andy Ho began his talk by locating for us his previous office at the Government House and that the government officials led by the Chief Executive used to meet 'underground', the telegram room, every morning at 9am.

Andy then moved on to enlighten us on the current political reality, that is no popular mandate, solid political party support, dependable votes in 70-seat Legco, neighborhood networks and reliable media support; yet lots of rules to follow, both written and unwritten. He shared that over 10,000 emails, 1,000 letters and telephone calls were received by the Chief Executive over public enquiries and petitions. During his years, there were crisis after crisis and the list went on. Andy also shared with us the diagram of public communications as follows:




Andy also revealed that on average the Chief Executive were given 34 seconds soundbites (word on own mouth) on the local Chinese TV media between 25 Feb to 25 April 2006, which is about 100 Chinese words, before reporter voice over whatever the Chief Executive had to say. He raised concerns over the local news reporting that with 24/7 coverage, little gate-keeping has been made; when he joined journalism 25 years ago at HK Standard, he was taught to treat reporting with fairness and objectivity, but it is not really the case anymore, advocacy took precedence over objectivity, even editors are vulnerable. In Hong Kong, libel law suits seem not a big worry.

As mentioned, over 50% of our reporters are below 4 years of experience in journalism and it is alarming that 67% of them are expected to quit journalism in less than 4 years while 62% looked/applied for a non-journalist post in the past 12 months. In the past, the attitude towards journalism is that if in doubt.... check it out, but nowadays, they would take another approach. Roxanne Roberts, columnist of The Reliable source, Washington Posts, summarize is nicely "We don't make mistakes, we just make updates". The typical example is that some journalists were taking a leading role in the incident of National Education. Because of this the government begins to explore ways to directly communicate their messages to their target audiences, but it becomes very costly.

Andy also reviewed the evolution of media communication at the present moment – the media cloverleaf:

THE MEDIA CLOVERLEAF: A VIRTUOUS CYCLE FOR AUTHORITY



Hong Kong has the highest weekly use of facebook with 92%, over US's 87%, Brazil 72% and Germany 58%, according to Ketchum 2011 Social Media Matters Survey. The HKSAR Government set up the facebook for condolences for the victims of The Philippines hostage incidence and received over 135,000 likes, which is a record for the government.

Before the end of his talk, Andy reviewed the second law of journalism – "It is not your fault, it is just your turn" - Arthur Sulzberger Jr, Chairman & Publisher, NY Times.

There were many questions raised by members, and Andy answered them fervently.

PP Laurence thanked our speaker for such a brilliant talk, and he did it in a very precise and efficient manner, corresponding to the no. of soundbites our CE of Hong Kong is enjoying with the media.

IPDG David promoted The One project by District for the second year. In Year One, 10 countries participated, and he would like to extend to more countries in this year.

Finally at 2:15 pm, President Nancy declared the close of the meeting with a toast to RI coupled with Rotary Clubs of Kowloon Golden Miles, HK Harbour, Metropolitan, Taipo, Peninsula South, Peninsula, and Hong Kong Island East. She then invited all guests and members to take a group photo.
