# SPOTLIGHT ON - In Flight Service



Have you ever wondered what goes on behind the scenes on the average flight? What do the flight staff do when they are not serving us our meals and drinks? What are the challenges they face, apart from unruly passengers and outside turbulence? Rotaractor Orange Chow gave us an enlightening presentation about the ups and downs (excuse the pun) of in-flight service, including the routine duties, flight preparation etc.

As a young flight attendant for Cathay Pacific he has seen it all. He started by articulating the sheer scope of work involved in the job - the role of the flight attendant includes being first-aid expert, cook, travel guide, waiter, security, emergency services...these are just a few of the talents that any flight attendant must have in order to do the job. Probably as passengers we take all of this for granted. It's challenging work, however, that's not to say it's not eniovable.

Orange shared with us some photos of the great places he's gotten to visit in the line of duty, and clearly he loves his work. He also told us about some of the things they have to deal with, like security scares (real or not) and badly behaved passengers (especially those where alcohol is involved). It's all in a day's

work and Orange gave us a very enjoyable and insightful overview of his career. When questioned 'what are the good things and bad things about the job'?..he specified. Good – free travel to amazing places. Bad – jetlag!! He confessed that even on this day, he had flown in from long haul this morning, and was lucky he wasn't nodding off at the lunch. We certainly weren't, as it was a very entertaining talk.


