SPOTLIGHT ON - Free medical consultation for the elderly



The Free Medical Consultation Services for the Underprivileged is a programme designed to offer care and medical expertise to those elderly in Hong Kong who do not have the means to have access to themselves, especially in situations whereby they cannot afford the time to join a waiting list.

Michael began by outlining the short term and medium to long term benefits of the programme, which are as follows:

Short term (now in progress) -

To provide free medical consultation services by non surgical General Physicians, Specialists and Para-medical professionals to the underprivileged or needy elders (aged 65 or above).

Medium and Long term (within 2 to 3 years)

- To initiate the linking up with other similar medical service projects within District 3450
- To provide a chain of medical care to the needy elders from Preventive Medicare (blood tests, body check etc).

The programme will offer Consultation (Western and Chinese medicine), Aftermath Caring, and Surgery.

Michael then emphasized that this is not a District or Rotary Club Project, because that way it can be more flexible.

It is RISK-FREE – backed by well qualified professionals and good insurance coverage. And requires no financial investment.

Michael stressed that the organising team involved is acting as an agent.

- Participating physicians and para-medical professionals will be invited to provide free consultation, drugs and/or treatment service to referrals . Participating general physicians (GPs) and para-medical professionals are required to provide 1 -2 free medical consultations per quota, subject to final agreement, once a week or once a fortnight.
- For specialists, they are required to provide 1-2 free medical consultation quota(s) for one year. They can make referrals to HA for follow up or prescribe drugs to the referred patients as his own discretion

The team will also collaborate with non political and non-profit making organisations (such as Salvation Army, AMS, St John, etc.) for referrals.

Volunteer physicians, medical specialists and para-medical professionals are invited to join this service project both within and outside the Rotary District 3450.

Members are urged to please send to all Rotarian doctors a personal e-mail about this project.

Finally, Michael outlined the benefits of the programme for Rotary. Which are:

- To let more professionals to know about Rotary.
- Enhance Rotary image
- Provide a better understanding of Rotary by the public
- Help Membership drive
- Encourage better cohesion and bonding of Rotarians
- Encourage Fellowship
- Cultivate the sense of Cross Areas/Clubs joint service initiatives
- Fund Raising

A Certificate of Appreciation will be presented to the kindhearted professionals who dedicate their time and resources.

Michael also emphasized that this is not a one-off Medicare care project, and as it evloves, the leadership of the team can be changed with a defined period for better leadership for sustainability.

Individual Rotarians, Rotary Club or other Individuals by referral are welcomed to join the project and on voluntary basis
