SPOTLIGHT ON - Love & Care for the Sick Foundation



As a qualified nurse working at Queen Elizabeth Hospital, Joyce recognized the need to provide free services to those elderly sick with little or no means to pay for them. The Love & Care for the Sick Foundation was established to provide such services to the elderly, through specially established service centers at various districts with low income families.

Joyce outlined their needs as finding more and more volunteers to visit the sick elderly on an ongoing basis. They are also in need of funding to cover the monthly expenses and running costs.

Joyce also shared a presentations of photos of their work. She quoted her inspiration for setting up the service from Learning and Innovating for Thrival and Thrivability in a Planetist Future' by Dr. Peter Ellyard , as follows:

- Promoting **a caring culture**
- Developing **circles of concern** and
- Developing **a global caring society**
