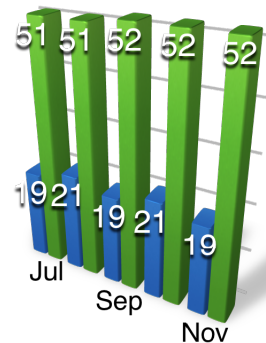

SPOTLIGHT ON - Improving your image



This topic had nothing to do with getting a new haircut, suit or set of teeth, and everything to do with how you present yourself and manage the way others see you. Image consultant Priscilla Chan gave an interesting interactive presentation. Her company mission statement reads: 'Our mission is to empower our clients to embrace their fullest potential and attain the breakthroughs they never thought possible!' Which she began to demonstrate using colour swatches (boards with multitudes of colour swatches of different tones). She pointed out that colours did have an impact on how we present ourselves. She used her colleague Thomas to illustrate which colours would brighten or darken his face. According to Pauline, its better to have a bright face. She also called Rtn. Stacy to step forward to take part in a demonstration to identify which colour schemes are suitable for her (Stacy always looks good in bright red, we know, she's a vivid personality). Overall it was a light interactive and engaging presentation, and shared some interesting insights into the topic that perhaps we would not usually think about in our lines of profession.

Where are you from?

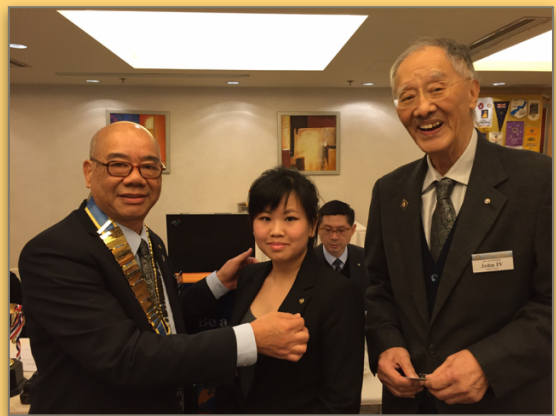
I was born and grew up in Hong Kong, and I went to Australia to study my Finance degree in the University of Adelaide.

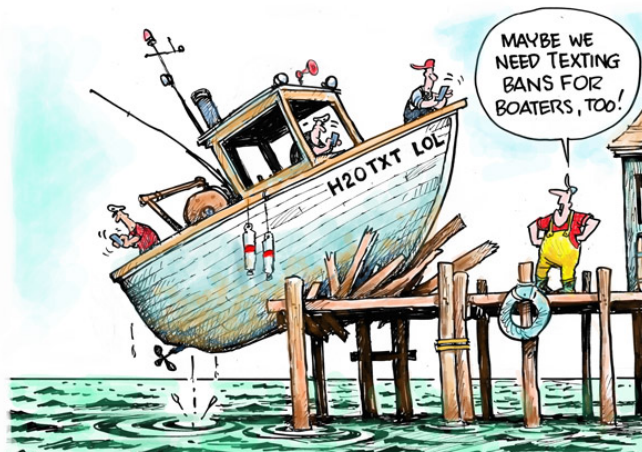
