Youth Outreach is a nonprofit organization in Hong Kong established in November 1991 as a crisis intervention center for youth. In the years since its establishment, the organisation has been devoting its services to help youths in

critical condition or those who face major crisis in their life.

Youth Outreach is dedicated to helping at-risk youth grow into responsible members of our community.

Reaching out to them. Loving, caring and welcoming them

Helping them find themselves and rebuild self-respect and self-confidence Creating platforms for them to grow and stand on their own feet. Their values are as follows:

- To love what young people love
- To have faith in the potential of young people
- To seek creative solutions
- To maintain a positive culture
- To be responsible in words and deeds
- To provide a friendly presence
- To encourage young people inspire each other through sharing of life experiences

- Reaching out, Loving and Caring at-risk youth
- Focusing on at-risk youth's talents and developing their potential
- Developing their strength through different cultural activities : hip hop, skateboarding, band music, fitness Thai boxing, etc.

Winnie gave us an overview of their work so far, and also outlined their focus during this year, which includes their strategic plan of reaching out to the at-risk youth by establishing an alternative youth culture platform to replace their triad cultures with positive cultures like hip hop dancing, skateboarding, rock band, and lately, fitness Thai boxing, etc. They also target to go into more primary schools to do preventive work as the youth problems are happening in lower age groups now.

She also outlined their coming cultural activities in West Kowloon, including the Friends of YO scheme, which involves the following classifications:

For donors giving

- HK\$30,000-49,999 Pearl Leader of FOYO
- HK\$50,000-99,999 (Jade Leader)
- And HK\$100,000 or above (Diamond Leader) for that year.



Clara then gave an update on next year's Rookie Stars contest, and outlined the success story to date. This concept was the original idea of DGE Eric when he was club President, and has grown in size. This year's show included 60 participating teams and

over 500 contestants. Great work and progress and we will continue to support and be involved.
