SPOTLIGHT ON - Forensic Dentistry



Dr Carl began by explaining how he got into this line of work, stating that it was at HKU that his eyes were opened to forensic dentistry, especially with the encouragement of the late Prof Ron Fearnhead, the founding Professor of Oral Anatomy at HKU and founder of the Hong Kong FOG. His connections with HKU and the Prince Philip Dental Hospital have never stopped since his BDS graduation in 1990, and he even returned to be one of the first batch of graduates of the MSc in Implant Dentistry in 2008. The hospital has provided a small laboratory for the Hong Kong FOG since its inauguration in 1983, and Dr Thomas Li and staff of the Oral Radiology Unit have provided unfailing support. He also explained "Forensic

dentistry or forensic odontology is broadly the use of dental evidence for identification or legal purposes. It's a very fulfilling field and uses both my interests in dentistry and law. Among my activities, I advise INTERPOL and am a consultant for the Hong Kong Forensic Odontology Group (FOG) and many groups in Southeast Asia and around the world. International cases I've helped with include identifying victims of the 2004 Asian Tsunami and 2002 Bali bombings. Forensic dentistry is a relatively young but increasingly important branch of dentistry. I feel both privileged and proud to receive the Hon FRCP, and hope it helps me to raise the profile of the field even more". Dr Carl then went on to give some examples of famous cases, especially Hong Kong murder cases, where it was forensic dentistry that solved the mystery, ncuding some grisly details of how. A very unusual and interesting talk.

ABOUT THE SPEAKER

Dr Carl Leung received his dental education in Hong Kong and his forensic training in Melbourne and London. He started his career in forensic dentistry in South East Asia since 1988. Currently he is a member of the central committee of the Chinese Forensic Medicine

Association in China and is also the president of the Hong Kong Forensic Science Society. Academically he is an honorary professor in forensic science of Tung Wah College and an honorary assistant professor in psychiatry in Li Ka Shing Faculty of Medicine, University of Hong Kong. Apart from his forensic career, Dr Leung has extensive administrative experience in medical and dental fields. He is a member of management broads in public hospitals, Chinese medicine clinics, dental groups and health industry.
