
A DANCING SUCCESS STORY

SPOTLIGHT ON - From Start-Up to Supermarket in 18 months



The speaker of the week was Jim Coke, the founder of Hilmann Reinier Brands Asia. Jim is a native Jamaican, educated at Cambridge. He shared a very interesting engaging and genuine talk about his entrepreneurial journey of building his coffee brand from scratch. It all started when his ex-girlfriend (then girlfriend) requested for him to ask his father to send some Jamaican coffee to Hong Kong. To his surprise James noticed that people in Hong Kong were curious about Jamaican coffee and thus he pursued to create his brand.

What occurred in the following 18 months was a combination of good chance and luck that was created by James willingness to ask questions, ask for opportunities, and to know what worked for him.

1. <u>Willingness to Know What Worked for Him</u>

Against all his friends' advice, Jim chose to distribute through Groupon. Groupon has a policy that it will pay 50% of the sales orders up front , and the goods are to be delivered 14 days later (and the remaining balance will be paid upon delivery). During the first Groupon sales campaign, on the first day of sales he only had 2 coffee pouches on stock. After receiving 50% of the 500 pouch order, he used the sales revenue he received from Groupon to purchase coffee from Jamacia and DHL-ed it back to HK within the 14 day period. So smart! That is how he started to build up his brand, and in his words, he said that "Groupon financed my business."

2. <u>Willingness to Ask for Opportunities</u>

Wherever Jim goes he carries his Coffee Sample sachet, so he is always prepared to give out samples. One time Jim was in a Park-N-Shop location and he walked straight up to the Store Manager and asked the store manager's opinion of his product and what would be possible to have his product sold in Park N'Shop. That led him to meeting one of the 2 expatriate Park N Shop store managers who then facilitated the pathway for Jims' product to be sold in Park N Shop stores. And throughout his presentation this theme echoed, James willingness to ask (shamelessly) paved the way for Asia Exclusive Distribution rights to Jamaican products as well as open the doors for Jims' coffee products to be distributed in Citistore.

Overall it was a very enlightening and engaging presentation. PP Paul Chan asked many thorough questions during the Q & A session (The questions were really great. PP Paul, please come again soon!) and PP Heman gave a classy thankyou to the speaker. Jim seems like a very interesting, genuine and nice character, we hope to see him in other events like fellowship and service projects.

About the speaker – Jim Coke

The son of a Jamaican farmer, Jim read Social and Political Sciences at Cambridge University obtaining both a Bachelor and Masters degree. After graduating, he began a career in banking as a risk manager before relocating to Singapore and becoming an entrepreneur. <u>Hilmann Reinier</u> Brands Ltd started off in Hong Kong as a coffee manufacturing business developing its own brand (Lily Kerridge) before being listed in several stores under the A.S. Watson Group. All this was achieved within 18 months.

Jim is the classic "bootstrapping entrepreneur". His achievements are remarkable because he landed in Hong Kong with no contacts, friends or family and battled his way through to Hong Kong's largest supermarket chain with a brand he developed from nothing. This was all achieved without the help of consultants, advisors, bank loans, local Chinese partners or foreign investors.

Jim's view on entrepreneurship is unconventional and at the same time practical and based almost entirely on the notion of "always doing more with less". Hilmann Reinier now develops new brands coming into Asia and has expanded its portfolio from coffee to beer, chocolates, tea, rum, malt drinks and stouts. The Hong Kong Entrepreneur: From Start-up to Supermarket in 18 months is Jim's account of his journey and is currently available as an E-Book.
