President's Message



This month's District theme is Membership & Retention, and last week I enjoyed a lively presentation from PDG Jones Wong at the District theme Membership & Retention Seminar. As well as giving us a snapshot history (a reminder for seasoned members, an education for newer ones), PDG Jonesalso reminded us what are the characteristics that make a good Rotarian. These being:

- A willingness to **share** Rotary with others. - A belief in service and a desire to accomplish more through association with others than can be done alone. - Demonstrating high ethical standards in your profession and life.

- A desire to be **active** in the club's meetings and activities.

As we constantly strive to introduce new members to our club, these are the pillars by which we should judge possible candidates. Do they embody them?

Usually only time will tell, but think of them more as a guide to whoever we might consider inviting into our special fellowship. It goes without saying that we need to build on our healthy membership. More than that, new members can inject some welcome new energy into what we do. PDG Jones also reminded us of our responsibility in this area: Achieve a net gain in membership. Small clubs (up to 49 members) must achieve a net gain of at least one member; large club (50 or more members) must achieve a net gain of at least two members. This also included a focus on achieving a net gain in female members. The presentation then tackled the question of retaining members, and also the common reasons why sometimes members resign, such as for example time, money or personal conflict issues. Which are understandable and unavoidable from time to time. We all have a responsibility to attract new members to our clubs, and we all also have a responsibility to ensure

that our members are engaged at all times. That means being involved, by looking out for each other, by keeping our club active and interesting. As we move forward into the Rotary Year of 2015/16, let's not take our members for granted.

Finally PDG Jones left us with some words of inspiration from RI. 'The more clubs we have, the more friends we have, and the more friends, the greater our opportunity for service' --- The Rotarians September 1953.

SPOTLIGHT ON - Fortune Pharmacal Limited



Bill Lai is the son of the founder of Fortune Pharmacal, manufacturer of Coltalin, one of Hong Kong's best known and best loved brands

The story of Fortune is a story of family as much as success. Bill told the story in a very personable and honest way, telling is about a

moment in 1992 when he was chatting to a foreigner after a game of golf, who eventually asked what he did. When Bill told him the reaction was "Wow, you guys are good". The person turned out to be from GSK, one of Fortune's main competitors. Inspired by this vote of confidence from a rival. Bill returned to Hong Kong and convinced his father to expand the Fortune product range beyond just painkillers. This led to some challenging times, however, by 1993 the company was making big plans for China, and opened up a marketing office there. This began to grow the business and by 2008 the company was operating with over 200 staff in China. The company then ventured into Shanghai, and today remains a great, Hong Kong home-grown success story. Although Bill admits that today's market is a different and more challenging proposition. More regulated and structured.

Bill's father retired in 2012, but still continues to come to work, and Bill himself had to adapt to a new life as a CEO. He now has big plans. The company is upgrading his manufacturing plant to new, larger premises in Yuen Long, and they are evolving the products line from OTC to prescription-based products. It's an exciting time for Fortune Pharmacal, and Bill is proud of the fact that they are now truly a 3-genrartin family business. He ended by telling us, with a tear of pride in his eye, that his son is now very much a part of the company.

Although Bill has had to sacrifice some of his h o b b i e s, s u c h a s photography and golf, he admits he is a 'Fortunate g u y'. A very moving presentation.
